According to U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics,* people who have a high school diploma will earn, on average, **\$9,412 MORE per year** than a non-high school graduate.

For the **244** people in Navajo County who earned a high school diploma through GED® testing in PY 2012-13, this represents a potential increase in taxable income of over **\$2,296,528** per year for Navajo County.

In Arizona, providers must meet rigorous standards and produce positive student outcomes to be funded. **Northland Pioneer College** is funded and authorized to provide adult education throughout Navajo County. The Arizona Department of Education–Adult Education Services allocated **\$283,831** to **Navajo County** for adult education services for the Program Year 2012-2013.



Community: **NEEDS**

Of the approximately 107,300 people living in Navajo County, 71% (75,932) are 18 years old and older. Of that number, 21% (15,865) lack a high school credential. 35% (2,453) of 16 to 19 year olds are not enrolled in school and do not have a high school credential.

5% of individuals 18 years and older (3,673) live in “linguistically isolated” households (all members of the household 14 years and over have at least some difficulty with English).

Adult Education in Navajo County: **DATA**

- 357 adults enrolled in adult education classes
- 18,960 instructional hours were provided in adult education classes
- \$14.97 of adult education funding was expended per instructional hour
- \$795 of adult education funding was expended per adult student (compared to over \$7,500 funding per K-12 student)
- 72% of enrolled students improved more than two grade levels
- 70% who sought a high school equivalency credential passed the GED® Test and earned a diploma
- 19% who sought a job found employment
- 47% who sought to retain or improve employment were successful
- 25% who had a goal of entering post-secondary education or training went on to further education
- County GED® Testing Data: **244** Arizona High School Equivalency Diplomas were issued.

SNAPSHOT: Adult Education in Navajo County

- 82% of the adults in Navajo County enrolling in adult education classes had reading, writing, and/or math proficiency skills below ninth grade.
- 37% of adult learners in Navajo County are between the ages of 25 and 44.
- 26% of adult learners in Navajo County are employed.
- 20% (7,509) of females in Navajo county lack a high school credential. The *National Assessment of Adult Literacy* research confirms that the educational attainment of the parents, particularly that of the mother, has a direct bearing on the educational achievement of a child.




Improving an adult's skills in reading, writing and/or math
