Meeting began at 9:11 a.m.:

1. Welcome and introductions: change Randy's name tent-retired
 - All in favor of last meeting's minutes
 - Mike McAfee: Anyone you think we should consider for this council? Need a cross section of people
2. JTED legislation overview-Jeanne Roberts: senate bill 15:25 restoration of \$29 million of \$30 million. Took whole year to do this grassroots legislation. Discussion of importance of business and industry in this effort: new course requirements and new program requirements-there will be programs that don't receive JTED funding, but none of transportation programs are in jeopardy. See requirements highlighted on handout. Use labor market material: high need, high skill, and high wage. (refer to handout-"Programs with Identified Industry Certification") There are forms that districts can submit for other certifications that aren't on list (example: iCar, not on list).

Doug: One of the main things we are struggling with is how we are going to pay for it(certifications)? If we pay for one, we have to pay for all. If you want to take a test, you have to pay for it.

Refer to Automotive Technologies handout: example of how they determine if a program is eligible or not.

Randy: how would a new program be started? Proposed local occupational program-have to be aligned to something and lead to a certification.

Randy: Snap-on input: add Snap-on certifications to other Transportation program areas where appropriate.



3. Vision and mission of advisory council-Mike McAfee: Don: change the word 'industry' to workplace/workforce and need to include the word community at end of mission; Dan: add to ensure (industry) and related program in vision;

4. Election of Chairperson: postponed to next meeting. Not enough people present.
