SEI Training Updates

NOTWITHSTANDING SECTION 15-203 OR SUBSECTION A OF THIS SECTION:

- A PROVISIONAL OR FULL STRUCTURED ENGLISH IMMERSION ENDORSEMENT MAY NOT BE REQUIRED FOR THE PURPOSES OF TEACHER CERTIFICATION PURSUANT TO SECTION 15-203 IF THE PERSON IS NOT BEING CERTIFICATED TO TEACH STUDENTS IN A SHELTERED ENGLISH IMMERSION OR STRUCTURED ENGLISH IMMERSION MODEL PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE.

SEI Training Updates (cont.)

1. LEAs and charters must be able to show evidence that their teachers instructing within the SEI model (including ILLP teachers) have received SEI training.
2. OELAS will monitor for this evidence during routine monitoring visits.

ALL teachers instructing in an SEI model will have one year to receive the required SEI training.

Highly Qualified Clarification

QUESTION: Does the passage of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) mean that Arizona will no longer require its Structured English Immersion teachers to be “highly qualified,” as defined by the No Child Left Behind Act?

Highly Qualified Clarification (cont.)

ANSWER: Because No Child Left Behind largely left the definition of the phrase “highly qualified” within the hands of the States, the changes in the statutory language brought about by ESSA will **NOT** conflict with this policy.

Highly Qualified Clarification (cont.)

THEREFORE: Arizona teachers instructing in the Structured English Immersion (“SEI”) model must meet the requirements set forth by the SEI Models promulgated by the State Board of Education.

According to the SEI Models:

- an elementary SEI teacher must be “**highly qualified**” in elementary content
- middle and high school SEI teachers must be “**highly qualified**” in Language Arts or English

-  Gives back to the states the power to identify the schools that need the most help.
-  Lets states determine how to measure student and school success.
-  Supports college- and career-ready standards.
-  Replaces [No Child Left Behind \(NCLB\)](#).
-  ESSA is also the third iteration, or extension, of the 1965 [Elementary and Secondary Education Act](#).

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


We Need Your Input!

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) was passed into federal law in December of 2015 to *replace No Child Left Behind*. ESSA is marketed as affording states greater flexibility and the new law encourages states and schools to innovate, while maintaining a focus on accountability, state and local systems of improvement and a more balanced assessment system.

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
