



Arizona's districts and charters are not getting the best bang for their technology buck.


- ★ LEAs spend \$281,000,000 per year for software applications statewide.
- ★ Smaller districts and charters account for 46% of the total \$281,000,000, but only serve 18% of the students in the state.

Smaller districts pay more than 10 times as much for Student Information System licenses compared to larger districts.

The statewide opt-in Student Information System (SIS) allows smaller LEAs to leverage their buying power to realize the per-student pricing larger districts enjoy. All LEAs benefit from competitive pressure on vendors for better pricing and service for everyone.

The statewide opt-in SIS provides an alternative for LEAs looking to reduce per-student costs and eliminate the burden of contract negotiation and management. Because the service is optional, LEAs choose if and when it is a good business decision for them.

All schools could opt-in to save on licensing costs and staff time used to run and maintain their own IT hardware and software systems, saving tens of millions of dollars every year.
