## PILOT PROJECT FACT SHEET

### WHY PARTICIPATE?

- 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC grantees will have the opportunity to implement family engagement strategies using the latest research by Dr. Maria Paredes
- Grantees will receive additional funding to support intensive leadership professional development in Family Engagement leading to a 'Trainer of Trainer' Certificate granted by Dr. Paredes and WestEd
- Participants will receive additional family engagement support services: professional development, technical assistance, coaching, data collection tools, and implementation resources for selected 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC pilot sites
- Those involved will use school improvement goals to increase student achievement on formative and summative tests through student-centered, high-impact family engagement strategies
- Implementation of these strategies will meet and exceed family engagement mandates for 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC and Title I Grants

### SUPPORT FUNDING FOR THE PILOT

- Enhancement Grant: \$7,000 a year per school site (registration fees, travel costs, materials, and consultation fees)

### DURATION OF PILOT

- One-year pilot (eight four-hour sessions)

### ELIGIBILITY TO PARTICIPATE

- Strong Leadership
- 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC Funds
- Recommendation from the 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC Arizona Department of Education Program Specialist

### GOALS OF THE FAMILY ENGAGEMENT PILOT

- Create a systems approach to meaningfully engaging families in student learning and achievement
- Use research and actionable student data to drive family engagement
- Build the capacity of teachers, administrators, and families to work collaboratively to drive student achievement
- Build local expertise on APTT's components, essential elements, and related practices
- Link all family engagement services and educational opportunities to student learning
- Collect and analyze program implementation data to evaluate program effectiveness

### SCHOOL TEAM OF THREE PARTICIPATION REQUIRED

Each principal will identify two additional building leaders to serve as the local site team. One leader should be linked to the 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC Grant. School teams will be expected to participate in the following professional development during the first year of the program:

- Regional Professional Development (Tucson, Phoenix and Flagstaff), Technical Assistance and Support Services: Eight four-hour sessions of professional development, technical support, and results-driven team collaboration.
- Team of three or more per school: Must include the site Principal, 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC Coordinator, and one other participant (e.g., Family Liaison, District Title I Coordinator, Curriculum Specialist, Data or Academic Coach)
- **First Training: Sept 16 (Phoenix), Sept 18 (Flagstaff), Sept 19 (Tucson), 10:00pm - 4:00pm. Must Register on the ADE Calendar of Events**
