### **Annie E. Casey Kids Count Data: 2021**

- Preschool-age children not in school: 66%
- Fourth grade children NOT proficient in reading: 69%
- Children whose parents lack secure employment: 27%
- Children living in households w/ high housing cost burden: 29%
- Children in single-parent families: 37%

Overall child wellbeing, state ranking:
Arizona ranks 40th out of the 50 states

#### The Impact of Housing Instability & Homelessness on Families



#### Possible Daily Realities for Families Experiencing Homelessness

- Transportation
- Access to Employment
- Food & Meals
- Demands/ Requirements of Services (housing, employment, SNAP benefits, etc.)
- Hygiene/ Access to Bathrooms
- Adequate space to study & do homewrk
- Privacy
- Unmet medical and/or mental health needs
- Safety Physical & Emotional

#### The Impact of Housing Instability & Homelessness on Families



#### INTERNAL: Emotional & Cognitive States

- Stress
- Anger
- Fear
- Mistrust/ suspicion
- Depression
- Frustration
- Embarrassment
- Exhaustion
- Lack of comprehension

#### **EXTERNAL: Outward Behaviors**

- Appearing disconnected/ "doesn't care"
- Appearing impatient/ rude to staff
- Ignoring phone calls/ emails
- Not completing paperwork/ not following through on referrals
- Questions everything
- Doesn't appear "grateful" for the help being offered

## **Culture and Cultural Competency**

#### Understanding the Impact of Cultural Beliefs



The cultural beliefs of individual family members and the entire family inform decisions made about the child and the family. Cultures shape our views on key issues such as family roles and goals, caregiving practices, learning, education, school readiness, child behaviors, and the nature of childhood itself



## **Family Capacity**

#### Supporting and Strengthening Families





- Ongoing, reciprocal communication with schools
- Opportunities to continually build cultural and social capital
- Support for family wellbeing
