SELECT classes can be taken for university credit for those teachers or administrators who are required by their school districts to have official transcripts and for those who may need to transfer hours out of state (tuition and associated fees apply). The classes can also be taken for professional growth contact hours for free.

Arizona Teacher Residency

There are so many reasons to support this work.

THE TEACHER RESIDENCY MODEL

Borrowing from the medical residency model, teacher residencies recruit recent college graduates (from any degree program) and midcareer switchers, place them in a year-long apprenticeship in the classroom of a skilled supervising teacher, provide graduate coursework that revolves around their teaching experience, cultivate community within the cohort, and support residents through induction. Residents receive financial inducements and, in exchange, commit to serving in partner districts for at least three years after their residency year.



PROVEN BENEFITS OF RESIDENCIES

- Teacher residencies boost teacher retention more than any other model: 70-80% of residency graduates are still in the classroom after 5 years.
- Teacher residencies successfully recruit a more racially diverse teaching force: while 80% of our nation's teachers are white, over 50% of residents identify as people of color.
- Teacher residencies also boost student achievement in the residency year and beyond.

Attention Rural Educators

The Borderlands Rural Teacher Caucus (RTC) is a community of practice that provides networking and mentoring for rural teachers and provides an opportunity for these educators to engage in advocacy work that is relevant to their local school community. The RTC's work will be framed around a deep dive into the factors that are current barriers and challenges as well as successes in rural education today. Each session will feature training on becoming an effective advocate and engaging with the field. Participants will learn the ways to successfully engage in advocacy efforts and can then use this knowledge to enhance the learning environment at their rural schools.

The Borderlands RTC is open to teachers from a rural school district in Arizona. There is no cost associated with membership. The application is competitive as there are 12 seats available each year. Previous RTC members will also be seated for the 22-23 school year.

By applying for the RTC, you are committing to attend all eight, 1.5-hour sessions throughout the 2022-2023 school year, which will all be conducted virtually on Zoom. All sessions but one will be held from 3:30 pm - 5:00 pm. Dates are:
