

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Migrant Education Program (MEP) is a federally funded, state-operated program under the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) that provides supplemental program services to the children, ages 3 through 21, of seasonal or temporary agricultural workers. In Arizona, the program delivers services primarily through local educational agencies (LEAs) that design programs to meet the unserved needs of children residing in their area.

With this Contract Abstract we seek authority to fund Yuma Elementary School District with a special mini grant to meet the needs of preschool migratory children in providing a Migrant Preschool.

Method of Determining Contract Amount(s)

Funding for Yuma Elementary School District was determined on the need identified by the district in their Mini-Grant application. The LEA provided a detailed description on how they will use their funds, how it supports the LEA's Service Delivery Plan, and how the program will be measured and evaluated. Funds provided will allow Yuma Elementary School District to increase funding to the LEA to meet the needs of preschool migratory children in providing a Migrant Preschool.
