

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

The Migrant Education Program (MEP) is a federally funded, state-operated program under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act that provides supplemental program services to the children, birth through age 21, of seasonal or temporary agricultural workers. In Arizona, the program delivers services primarily through local educational agencies (LEAs) that design programs to meet the unserved needs of children residing in their area.

With this Contract Abstract we seek authority to fund Palo Verde Elementary School District with a special mini grant to cover travel costs for the identification and recruitment of migratory students in the Tonopah Area, servicing these preschool students and medical and dental services for 13 students.

**Purpose:**

To increase funding to Palo Verde Elementary School District in order to identify and recruit migratory students in the Tonopah Area, service the migratory preschool students and fund medical and dental services for 13 students. This funding will further support the LEA's plan to assist Migrant students in their academic progress toward meeting Arizona State Standards. This additional funding will also serve the purpose of assisting Migrant students to fully participate in school and district wide activities.

This is a one-time opportunity for additional funding for Palo Verde Elementary School District.

**Explanation of Contract:****Previous Contract History**

Palo Verde Elementary School District has be awarded \$91,995.42 for FY13.

**Number Affected (Students, Teachers, Public, as appropriate)**

Increasing funding to the LEA to provide identification and recruitment of migratory students in the Tonopah area, provide preschool services to migratory students and medical and dental services to identified migratory students.

**Method of Determining Contract Amount(s)**

The method in determining funds is based on the need from the LEA. The LEA applies for a Mini-Grant, which provides a detailed description on how they will use their funds, how it supports the LEAs Service Delivery Plan, and how the program will be measured and evaluated. ADE evaluates the application on a needs basis. Funds provided will allow Palo Verde Elementary School District to identify and serve migratory students in the Tonopah area.

**Evaluation Plan**

School Districts are subject to monitoring visits by staff of the ADE Migrant Education Program Office. During these monitoring visits the district Migrant Education Program is reviewed to determine if program goals and objectives are being met.
