## Executive Summary

High school graduation rates are vital indicators of the success of various school improvement programs and of education reform efforts in general. The purpose of this study is to examine the proportion of students within the cohort class of 2001 who completed Arizona high school graduation requirements within five years. The cohort class of 2001 is comprised of students who entered ninth grade in the fall of the 1997-1998 school year and graduated from twelfth grade by the end of the 2001-2002 school year.

This report provides information about the number and proportion of students who fell into one of the following categories after their fourth year of high school: dropped out<sup>1</sup>, status unknown or remained enrolled for a fifth year of high school. It also includes the proportion of students that obtained a General Educational Development certificate (GED)<sup>2</sup> within five years and a subsequent fifth year graduation rate, which is calculated using the number of students who graduated within five years as a proportion of the cohort membership. Herein, these rates are summarized at the state level, by gender and ethnicity, by county, and by district and school.

\* \* \* \* \*

This report is based on a longitudinal study for which student enrollment and transfer activity were tracked over a five year period to determine the proportion of students that entered high school in the 1997-1998 school year and graduated within five years (by the spring of 2002). This longitudinal method provides information about a particular cohort of students as it progresses through high school.

The cohort class of 2001 had a membership of 60,367 and consisted of five distinct ethnic groups. White students made up the largest proportion of the cohort at 56.4% and Asian students the smallest, making up 2.2% of the cohort population. (see Figure 1)

A brief overview of the cohort class of 2001 shows that:


- it had a total membership of 60,367 students
- 72.9 % graduated in five years**
- 70.8% graduated in four years
- 7.7% enrolled in a 5<sup>th</sup> year of high school and
- 0.6% received a GED (high school equivalency certificate)

Data presented in this report show a wide gender gap in the five year graduation rates for this cohort: more than 76% of the females received high school diplomas, while less than 70% of the males graduated.


In addition to gender differences found in this study, there is a wide gap in the graduation rates of different ethnic groups. Hispanic and Native American students showed consistently low graduation rates, 60.3% and 64.4%, respectively, while White and Asian rates were much higher at nearly 81% and 85.2%, respectively.

Further analysis of graduation rates shows that differences found in gender and ethnic groups compound to reveal even larger gender gaps within certain groups. White and African American females graduated at a rate that was nearly 6% above that of the males in each ethnic group. Hispanic females graduated at a rate nearly 8% above the male graduation rate, the largest within ethnic group difference. (see Figure 2)

The most telling statistic in the current report is the differences between the four and five year graduation rates within each ethnic group. The largest gender difference within an ethnic group is seen in Native American males: 55.7% graduated in four years while over 61% earned a diploma in five, a difference of 5.3%. Similar increases are seen with Hispanic males and Native American females: the fifth year rates increased by 3.6% and 3.7%, respectively when compared to their four year rates.

The Arizona Department of Education (ADE) is committed to continued improvement of educational indicators by making the most accurate data available to policy makers and the public. As the state has moved to a standards based educational system and away from a “seat time” approach to graduation, five year graduation rates will continue to be used to measure the proportion of students who meet the standards.

## **Introduction**

The calculations of four and five year graduation rates result from cooperative efforts among public school districts and charter schools, the ADE and the Arizona State Legislature. Presently, state school accountability efforts require greater attention to performance measures, such as the graduation rate, which serve as key indicators of a school's success in educating its student population. AZ LEARNS, Arizona's school accountability system, includes a school classification system based on a set of performance measures, including the five year graduation rate.<sup>3</sup>

### **Reporting Period**

This report includes four and five year graduation rate calculations for the cohort class of 2001. Members of this class entered their ninth grade year in the fall of 1997 and were tracked from the first day of the 1997-1998 school year to the last day of the spring semester in the 2001-2002 school year. For the cohort class of 2001, summer graduates after the four year Spring commencement in 2001 have not been included in the four year graduation rate; these students have been counted as fifth year graduates.<sup>4</sup> For the purposes of this study, students who graduated after their fifth year Spring commencement are not included as graduates.

### **Definitions<sup>5</sup>**

The following terms are used within this report and are meant to convey these associated meanings:

**Cohort class** is defined as the group of students that entered ninth grade for the first time in the Fall of 1997, independent of the state or district where each student first enrolled. These students were expected to advance through high school as a group and become part of the same graduating class within five years after the start of their ninth grade year (in the Spring of 2002). Students who began their ninth grade year at one school and transferred to another school before their fifth year Spring commencement are still a part of the same cohort class.

**Class membership** represents the total student count within the cohort class and is defined according to the following:

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Class Membership

A class membership for any given school may change from year to year as students transfer in and out of schools. The accuracy of a school's class membership count is dependent on the school's ability to track student activity over the course of five years. (For more information, see *Limitations to Current Research*, p. 7)

**Four year dropout rate** is expressed as a percentage of the class membership and reflects the proportion of the cohort class of 2001 that left within the first four years of high school and did not return, graduate, transfer, receive a GED or die.

**Status unknown rate** is expressed as a percentage of the class membership and reflects the proportion of the cohort class of 2001 that left within the first four years of high school, did not return, graduate, transfer, receive a GED or die and whose academic status and location are unknown to the schools from which the students have left.

**GED rate** is expressed as a percentage of the class membership and reflects the proportion of the cohort class of 2001 that did not receive a high school diploma but earned a GED by the Spring commencement of the fifth year. To qualify for this outcome, the former student must have received a GED certificate, not merely enrolled in preparatory classes.

**Still enrolled after fourth year** is expressed as a percentage of the class membership and reflects the proportion of the cohort class of 2001 that did not receive a high school diploma by the end of summer recess of the fourth year but remained enrolled to attend a fifth year.

**Four year graduation rate** is expressed as a percentage of the class membership and reflects the proportion of the cohort class of 2001 that received a high school diploma by their **fourth** year Spring commencement in 2001.

**Five year graduation rate** is expressed as a percentage of the class membership and reflects the proportion of the cohort class of 2001 that received a high school diploma by their **fifth** year Spring commencement in 2002. This proportion is calculated using the total number of students who graduated within four years, as well as those who returned for a fifth year and graduated:

$$\left( \frac{\text{Graduates within four years} + \text{graduates in the fifth year}}{\text{Cohort membership}} \right) \cdot 100$$

### **Transfer Documentation**

A student is not counted as a dropout if there is documented evidence of a transfer to another school that offers a high school diploma. School records must indicate the withdrawal status of each student who leaves the school. Documentation of a student transfer to another school consists of either (1) a request from another school for a transfer of the student's records or (2) information from a responsible adult that the student is enrolled in another educational facility from which (s)he may receive a high school diploma.

## **Methodology**

After students entered ninth grade for the first time in the Fall of 1997, they were identified as members of the cohort class of 2001. Over the next five years, each public school in Arizona tracked enrollment, transfer and graduation activities of students attending their schools. Four years later, after the Spring commencement in 2001, each school attributed one of the following outcomes to every student who was a member of the cohort class of 2001: *graduated, still enrolled, dropped out, status unknown, or GED recipient*. One year after the four year outcomes were reported, students who were members of the cohort class of 2001, and who graduated in a fifth year, were reported as five year graduates. Likewise, students who received a GED in the fifth year were reported as fifth year GED recipients. Four year and five year data on members of this cohort class were entered into a Graduation Rate Study online computer application and electronically submitted to the ADE.<sup>6</sup> The ADE distributed forms and instructions for data collection to high schools via regional training centers and by mail. High schools required to submit data were defined as those having had student membership in *one or more* of the following grades over the course of four years *and* offered a high school diploma:

- Membership in ninth grade in the 1997-1998 school year, *or*
  - Membership in tenth grade in the 1998-1999 school year, *or*
  - Membership in eleventh grade in the 1999-2000 school year, *or*
  - Membership in twelfth grade in the 2000-2001 school year, *or*
  - Graduated members of the cohort class of 2001 in the 2001-2002 school year
- And-**
- Offered a high school diploma

Schools that met these criteria were considered to have served members of the cohort class of 2001 at some point during the students' high school years and were required to

submit data even if none of those students received a diploma from that school. Therefore, if all members of the cohort transferred to other educational facilities, it is possible for a school to have a class membership of zero with a corresponding zero graduation rate.

As of 12 August, 2002, data were received from 380 public schools that satisfied one or more of the membership criteria stated above. In order to validate the data, the ADE conducted checks and contacted schools and districts to resolve discrepancies and clarify questions about inconsistent numbers. Membership counts and the associated four and five year cohort rates were verified with districts that served nearly 65% of the state's cohort membership.

### **Limitations to Current Research**

This longitudinal study requires the use of five years of student records. The validity of this report is dependent upon a school's ability to track students who enter or leave an educational facility over time. Many students who are classified as *status unknown*, or *dropouts*, may have transferred to another educational facility in the state. A school's inability to track these students may artificially inflate the four year cohort class dropout rate and result in the under reporting of the class's graduation rate. However, schools have made improvements in their record keeping, and the ADE anticipates that improvements will continue to occur, due to emphases placed on school accountability and stronger reporting requirements.

**Various School Types.** The state of Arizona houses a wide range of campus types including traditional, charter, alternative and schools in correctional facilities. The reader should note that, in general, different types of schools serve inherently different groups of students. Therefore, the dropout and graduation rates for different types of facilities should be interpreted using different groups of assumptions. For example, some schools target "at hope" students, a population in which a large percentage has already dropped out of school. Thus, the graduation rates of these schools, many of which are relatively low, tend to represent the proportion of students receiving high school diplomas *after* dropping out. In the end, graduation and corresponding dropout rates for different types of schools may be reflective of the state's dropout population, not the overall student population, that either receives a diploma or that drops out for a second time.

**GED recipients.** To qualify for a fourth or eventual fifth year GED outcome, a student must have received a GED prior to the end of the reporting period. In the past, the state provided a list of GED recipients. As this is no longer a standard practice, a school must use any resource necessary to determine the status of a GED candidate, relying on interpersonal correspondence and communication. As a result, GED recipients are currently difficult for schools to track and may cause a drastic under-reporting of former students who fit into this category. As student tracking becomes more accurate in the future (see *Changes In Data Collection*, p. 8), the reporting of GED recipients will become increasingly more precise.

### **Changes in Data Collection**

Beginning with the current report, the ADE has begun to produce a five year graduation rate study, which will include four year graduation rates for each cohort class as subsets of the five year rates. A five year graduation rate reflects the proportion of students in a cohort class who receive high school diplomas by the Spring commencement of their fifth year. The reasons for the move to a five year graduation rate analysis are the increased emphasis on student proficiency with the Arizona Academic Standards as the basis for graduation and less emphasis on “seat time” (requirements). A standards based system recognizes that some students will require more than four years to demonstrate the level of proficiency necessary to meet the Arizona Academic Standards.

The reporting period for graduation rate data has changed from previous years. The cohort class of 2000, based solely on a four year rate, was tracked from the first day of classes in the fall of 1996 until the last day of summer recess four years later, which included summer graduates after the four year Spring commencement as four year graduates. The reporting period for the current study encompasses the months from the first day of classes in the Fall of 1997 through the Spring commencement five years later, in 2002. With this change, those who graduate in the summer after the four year Spring commencement are counted as five year graduates, not four year graduates. In addition, those who graduate after their fifth year Spring commencement are not included as graduates in the current study.

As schools and districts push to overcome student tracking and reporting difficulties, the ADE is working diligently to implement an online computer tracking system, termed the Student Accountability Information System (SAIS). Once operational, future graduation rate data will be collected using SAIS, which will produce a more efficient and accurate student tracking system. Schools and districts will be required to submit student enrollment and transfer activities at several junctions during the school year, allowing for SAIS to improve the accuracy of data significantly.

## **Results and Analysis**

The four year dropout and still enrolled rates, along with five year GED and four and five year graduation rates for the cohort class of 2001, were computed and are presented in the following tables. Percentages in each category were calculated using the proportion of students to the total class membership count. The four year dropout rates presented in the following results are specific to the cohort class of 2001 and cannot be compared to the annual dropout rates calculated in the Annual Dropout Rate Study.

**Statewide Dropout, GED, Still Enrolled and Graduation Rates**

The class of 2001 had a membership count of 60,367. Of those, 73%, or 44,022, received high school diplomas in five years. Likewise, 7.7% were still enrolled at the end of four years and 0.6% had obtained a GED. (See Table 1)

**Graduation Rate by Gender**

A gender gap can be seen in the graduation rates for the cohort class of 2001. These data support a large body of literature dedicated to gender differences in graduation rates which indicates that females are graduating at a higher rate than their male counterparts. As seen here, of the 29,635 female members of the class of 2001, more than 76% obtained high school diplomas, 139 (0.5%) obtained a GED. The graduation rate for males of this cohort class is lower at just under 70%. (See Table 2)

**Graduation Rate by Race/Ethnicity**

Data for the cohort class of 2001 also show pronounced differences in the graduation rates by ethnicity. These data show Asian students have the highest graduation rate at 85.2%, followed by White students at nearly 81%. Hispanic students in this class show the lowest graduation rate at 60.3%. Also, White students in this cohort class have the highest rate of GED recipients over five years at 0.7%. (See Table 3)

**Graduation Rate by Gender and Race/Ethnicity**

When ethnicity results are broken down by gender, as seen in **Table 4**, the differences found in each of these ethnic categories compound and the gender gaps become more evident. As seen in Table 3 above, Hispanic, Native American and African American graduation rates are much lower than White and Asian rates, but the gender rates within each show wider gaps still. As these data show, Hispanic males have the lowest graduation rate at 56.4%. Asian female students in this class have the highest graduation rate at more than 88%. The largest gender difference within a racial category is seen in the Hispanic population: 64.3% graduation rate for females and a 56.4% for males, a difference of 7.9%. African American and Native American males in this class show graduation rates at just above 60%, which, along with the Hispanic male rate, are lower than any other group of students presented here. Likewise, the still enrolled rates for these students are the highest of any other gender and ethnic group combination.

**Graduation Rate by County**

Greenlee County, while serving the fewest number of students in the cohort at 130, graduated the highest percentage in four years at just under 91%. Maricopa, serving the greatest number of students, graduated 25,063 of the 35,062 students served (73.4%).




**Graduation Rate by District and School**

Data for schools and districts are provided in Table 6. These data represent those schools that had membership for the cohort class of 2001 in any given year. Schools that did not offer a high school diploma or did not, at any point, serve students who were members of the class of 2001, were not required to submit data for this report. Charter facilities have been marked with a ↗ symbol. **Note: the four year dropout rates presented in the following results are specific to the cohort class of 2001 and cannot be compared to the annual dropout rates calculated in the Annual Dropout Rate Study.**
