Bookmaking Materials for the webinar - Ziploc Book:

1. Sandwich size Ziploc or seal-able baggies (at least 5 baggies per participant, but you can use more)
2. 4 X 6 Index cards (You will need the same number of cards as baggies for each participant)
3. Stapler(s)
4. Tape
5. Pencils/pens/colored pencils and/or markers
6. Optional: Washi Tape or decorative Ducktape

Take home materials for Homework kit: (Please include your teens on receiving these items)

1. Paper (copy, construction and/or lined – consider what's best for the age group of your students)
2. Scissors
3. Colored pencils, crayons, and/or markers
4. Pencils & pens
5. pencil sharpener
6. Glue or glue sticks
7. Stapler
8. Tape
9. Extra Ziplocs and index cards so participants can make more Ziploc books at home
10. **Optional:** One copy of Hunters of the Great Forest by Deni Nolan or an example of any wordless children's book
