Please print the following media release as a free public service announcement.

Today announced its sponsorship of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Child and Adult Care Food Program administered by the Arizona Department of Education, Community Nutrition Programs. Meals will be provided for free or at a reduced-price for children whose families meet the income eligibility listed below. Reduced-price meals will cost no more than \$0.40 for lunch and supper, \$0.30 for breakfast, and \$0.15 for snacks. Children from families who do not meet the income eligibility below will still receive a meal at a cost of \$ and snacks at a cost of \$. A foster child, or a child who is a member of a household receiving SNAP, FDPIR or TANF assistance, or a Head Start participant is automatically eligible to receive free meal benefits. Adult participants who are members of SNAP or FDPIR households or who are SSI or Medicaid participants are automatically eligible to receive free meal benefits. All meals are served without regard to race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability. We look forward to providing nutritious meals.
