

Arizona Department of Education Child and Adult Care Food Program **New Applicant Guide**

Thank you for your interest in applying for the Child and Adult Care Food Program in Arizona! There are five steps to the application process:

- **Step 1**: Complete the online <u>Introduction to CACFP</u> and <u>Civil Rights Compliance</u> trainings.
 - **<u>Step 2</u>**: Attend How to Operate the CACFP in-person <u>Nutrition Track</u> and <u>Administrative Track</u> trainings.
 - Step 3: Mail in the Intent to Apply documents within 15 calendar days of attending training.
 - <u>Step 4:</u> Submit the online Management Plan and Budget and complete a Pre-Approval Visit.
 - **<u>Step 5</u>**: Submit your application in the CNPWeb system.

If you have not completed steps 1 and 2, please visit http://www.azed.gov/hns/startcacfp/ and complete the training requirements to be able to advance in the CACFP applications process.

This worksheet provides guidance to help get organized and successfully complete steps 3, 4, and 5 in the applications process for the CACFP. Many needed forms are provided by ADE and have been embedded in this document via hyperlinks. Step 3 – Intent to Apply Packet

Within 15 calendar days of attending "How to Operate CACFP" In-Person Training, a complete 'Intent to Apply' packet must be mailed to ADE's Phoenix office. The following documents are required to be submitted to ADE as indication of your intent to apply to participate in the CACFP.

- 2 Permanent Agreements (2 originals, use blue ink)
- □ Sponsor and Site Add/Change/Delete Form
- □ ADE Connect Request for Entity Administrator
- □ <u>AZ W-9 & Vendor Authorization Form</u> (use blue ink)

<u>**Resource:**</u> ADE *highly* encourages you use the step-by-step <u>How to Complete the Intent to Apply</u> guide when completing these documents. Submitting an incomplete or incorrectly completed packet can significantly delay or prevent the ability to advance in the applications process.

<u>NEXT STEPS</u>: ADE will receive your Intent to Apply packet. It will be reviewed and assessed for completeness. If your packet is incomplete or incorrectly completed, ADE will contact you and request revisions or return your application.

If/when your Intent to Apply Packet is deemed complete by ADE, it will be processed, and you will be notified via email when you are ready to advance to step 4.

Step 4 – Management Plan and Budget

Congratulations on reaching step 4 of the applications process! This process is the most labor-intensive step of the applications process – but fear not, ADE is here to help.

You should have received an email sharing that your Intent to Apply packet has been processed and you are ready to advance to step 4. This email contains a wealth of helpful information:

- Sponsor Name, Site Name, and CTDS Number: This is how your organization is established in ADE's system.
- Entity Administrator: The email lists your assigned Entity Administrator. This person can assign permissions to applications in ADE's online system.

- <u>How to Grant Permissions in ADEConnect</u>: Attached, there is a step-by-step guide for the Entity Administrator to follow to grant permissions to the systems needed to complete the remainder of your CACFP application.
- Assigned Program Specialist: You will also find the contact information for your <u>assigned program specialist</u>. This person will be your CACFP go-to and is there to answer and address all CACFP questions or concerns.

Accessing the Management Plan and Budget:

To access the system, your Entity Administrator must grant you permissions by following the steps outlined in the <u>How to</u> <u>Grant Permissions in ADEConnect</u> guide. For assistance, contact ADE Support at (602) 542-2222.

Completing the Management Plan and Budget:

Once you have access, you will begin step 4. As you start, bear in mind these helpful hints:

- Save your changes regularly. The system times out after 10 minutes. If you are timed out prior to pressing save, all data entered will be lost.
- Many forms are provided by ADE. They have been hyperlinked to this checklist and are available on our website at www.azed.gov/hns/cacfp/renewalresources/.
- Review the online <u>Management Plans and Budgets System training</u> for information about the system.
- Rely on your assigned program specialist! We are here to help and are happy to answer your questions.

Now, we are going to walk through the Management Plan and Budget.

Management Plan

SPONSOR INFORMATION:

- DUNS #: To lookup or request a DUNS#, visit the <u>Dun & Bradstreet webpage</u>.
- Federal ID #: This is your tax/employer ID. It is a 9-digit number.
- Documents Upload:
 - Food Service Contract Document, *if applicable*. *Contact Phil Grant at <u>HNSContracts@azed.gov</u> for assistance and contract approval.*
 - Organization's Certificate of Incorporation visit <u>AZ Corporation Commission webpage</u> to search for an online certificate of good standing.
 - o <u>Policy document for Computer generated meal count system, if applicable.</u>
 - Free and Reduced-Price Policy Statement (<u>Pricing</u>) (<u>Non-Pricing</u>)
 - List of Board Members with Addresses private non-profits only upload a list of your board members with addresses
 - Tax Exempt Letter private non-profits only upload your organization's tax exemption letter
 - o Media Release Document (Pricing) (Non-Pricing)

- Organizational Chart Upload the organizational chart for your organization.
- Annually Required Training Certificates Upload How to Operate Nutrition and Administrative Track and Online Civil Rights Compliance Training Certificate (<u>How to Print Training Certificates</u>)

- Documents Upload:
 - Licensing or Child Care Standards documents: Upload the site's license to operate. If the site does not have a license, complete and upload <u>ADE's Child Care Standards for Unlicensed Facilities</u> document.

ADMINISTRATIVE CAPABILITY:

- Proposed Date for CACFP Annual Training and Annual Civil Rights: This must fall between October 1-September 30 of the <u>following</u> program year.
- Documents Upload:
 - Job Descriptions that include assigned CACFP responsibilities and duties: Upload the job descriptions for staff with CACFP duties at your organization. For guidance, view ADE's Sample Job Descriptions.
 - CACFP Annual Training Agenda and Sign-In Sheet: (ADE Template) Upload the training agenda and sign-in sheets from your internally provided CACFP training. The agenda must list the topics covered and the location and date of training.
 - Civil Rights Training Agenda and Sign-In Sheet: (ADE Template) Upload the training agenda and sign-in sheets from your internally provided Civil Rights training. The agenda must list the topics covered and the location and date of training.
 - o <u>Sample Monitoring Schedule</u> for multi-site sponsors only
 - Recordkeeping Policy (Single Site) (Multi-Site)
 - o Menus (ADE Sample Cycle Menu) (ADE Menu Template)
 - o <u>Building for the Future Document</u>

- o <u>Civil Rights Pre-Award Document</u>
- o <u>Sample Unannounced Review Policy</u> for multi-site sponsors only
- o Outside Employment Policy (<u>ADE Sample</u>)

FINANCIAL VIABILITY:

This section is reviewed and scored by one of ADE's Audit Specialists. Please be thorough, detailed, and honest in your responses.

- Responsible Principals: At least two different people must be listed. The address must be personal, non-business mailing address.
- Projected Revenue Sources:
 - Income Sources Table: To be a financially viable candidate for the CACFP, you must have sufficient funding sources available to sustain operations of the CACFP without relying on CACFP reimbursement. Consider tuition and fees, unrestricted funds, DES funds, etc.
 - Anticipated Monthly Reimbursement: Calculate your projected annual CACFP reimbursement using <u>ADE's</u> <u>Instructions for Calculating Projected Annual CACFP Reimbursement</u>, then divide by 12 to determine the approximate monthly amount.
- Documents Upload:
 - <u>Procurement Standards/Plan Document</u> Note! Information must be inputted on page 1, 6, and 7.
 - Satisfaction of Judgements/Liens (if applicable): If you've had a historic judgement or lien, please upload documentation demonstrating action has been made to address the issue(s). This may include a payment plan, written explanation of the circumstance, result of a hearing, etc.

CERTIFICATION STATEMENTS:

Once you've completed the Sponsor Information, Site Information, Administrative Capability, and Financial Viability pages, finalize your Management Plan by reading the Certification Statements. If they read true and correct, check the boxes and save and submit your Management Plan.

Budget

Now, we will cover the Budget. The budget is how you anticipate spending your CACFP reimbursement and can be revised at any time.

Considerations:

- No more than 15% of anticipated reimbursement may be spent on Administrative Expenses.
- ADE requires at least 50% of anticipated reimbursement be spent on food.
- You must operate a non-profit food service, meaning all your reimbursement must be spent on allowable CACFP funds.

Resources:

<u>Budget Spreadsheet</u>: ADE has created an optional <u>budget spreadsheet</u> to assist in the preparation of budget figures prior to inputting them in your Budget.

<u>ADE's Instructions for Calculating Projected Annual CACFP Reimbursement</u>: Steps to calculating projected CACFP Reimbursement

- Facility Information:
 - Administrative Square Footage: This includes the square footage of the office area used for the CACFP.
 - Operational Square Footage: This includes the kitchen and total square footage of tables used for the meal service.
 - o Total Square Footage: This is the total square footage of your facility.
- Labor Cost Administrative:

- Position: Commonly, the owner, director, assistant director, office manager, and monitor(s) perform administrative tasks.
- CACFP Duties: Administrative Labor includes the time spent on administrative tasks, such as recordkeeping, training, monitoring, completing applications and claims, and planning for the CACFP.
- Number of Staff: The number of staff conducting administrative labor should not exceed 1-2 staff person(s)/site.
- Hours per day for CACFP Duties: ADE anticipates approximately 10 hours a month be spent on administrative duties, which equates to approximately 0.25-0.5 hours per day.
- Salary/Wage per hour: Input the hourly wage of the corresponding staff person.
- CACFP Portion of Benefits: Most operators choose to exclude benefits from their CACFP budget. If you choose to include the CACFP Portion of Benefits, complete the following calculation:
 (Administrative Square Footage ÷ Total Square Footage) X Gross CACFP Pay = CACFP Portion of Benefits
- Facility Cost Administrative:
 - Depreciation or Rent (monthly): Input the monthly rent or depreciation. The amount inputted must match the depreciation schedule or rental/leasing agreement uploaded to the site information on your Management Plan. The CACFP allowable portion will automatically calculate.
 - Contracted Services: Most operators choose to exclude contracted services from their CACFP budget. Administrative contracted services may include a CACFP portion of a storage facility, computer maintenance, etc. If you would like to include these services, connect with your assigned program specialist for information and approval.
 - Communication Costs: A CACFP portion of phone and internet costs may be attributed to the CACFP. If you choose to include communication costs on your CACFP budget, input the type of communication cost under description (i.e. phone and internet) and the approximate monthly cost. The CACFP allowable portion will automatically calculate.
 - Other Costs: Other Costs are rarely included as they require prior written approval from your assigned program specialist. For guidance surrounding what type of expenses fall under 'Other Costs,' contact your assigned program specialist.
- Facility Cost Operational:
 - Depreciation or Rent (monthly): Input the monthly rent or depreciation. The amount inputted must match the depreciation schedule or rental/leasing agreement uploaded to the site information on your Management Plan. The CACFP allowable portion will automatically calculate.
 - Contracted Services: Most operators choose to exclude contracted services from their CACFP budget.
 Operational contracted services may include a CACFP portion of a pest control service, refrigerator repair, etc. If you would like to include these services, connect with your assigned program specialist for information and approval.
 - Utility Costs: A portion of electric, gas, water, and waste bills may be attributed to the CACFP. Under Description, input the type of utility being included on your budget (i.e. Electric and Gas), and the approximate monthly cost. The CACFP allowable portion will automatically calculate.
 - Other Costs: Other Costs are rarely included as they require prior written approval from your assigned program specialist. For guidance surrounding what type of expenses fall under 'Other Costs,' contact your assigned program specialist.
- Food and Supplies Costs:
 - Describe how you determined your anticipated food and supplies costs and input the approximate yearly amount. Recall, ADE expects at least 50% of your anticipated reimbursement be attributed to food.

• Projected Annual CACFP Reimbursement for upcoming fiscal year: To calculate your projected annual reimbursement, use ADE's Instructions for Calculating Projected Annual CACFP Reimbursement.

NEXT STEPS:

- **Pre-Approval Visit:** Once you have submitted your Management Plan and Budget, alert your assigned program specialist. At this time, they will begin reviewing your submission and schedule a pre-approval visit. The pre-approval visit is an opportunity for ADE to determine if your processes are consistent with program regulations or if you need some additional support prior to approval.
- Management Plan and Budget Processing: Your assigned specialist will review your Management Plan and Budget. Once it has been reviewed, they will contact you and explain any revisions that are needed. You will then work collaboratively with your specialist until your application is ready for director approval. Then, it will be reviewed by a Community Nutrition Programs Director. Once reviewed, your specialist will notify you to proceed to the fifth and final step of the CACFP applications process.

Step 5 – CNPWeb Site and Sponsor Application

Congratulations! You have reached the fifth and final step of the CACFP applications process. This step requires you transpose information from your approved Management Plan and Budget to the CNPWeb Site and Sponsor applications.

Transferring the Management Plan and Budget to the CNPWeb: The figures inputted on the CNPWeb must match your approved Management Plan, therefore, ADE created this an optional worksheet to provide ease when transferring information from the Management Plan and Budget to the CNPWeb.

<u>NEXT STEPS</u>: Your assigned program specialist will review your CNPWeb site and sponsor applications once submitted. If there are errors, they will request revisions. If/when the applications are free of errors, your application will be approved, and you will be ready to begin claiming for CACFP operations.
