










AZELLA Assessment

The Arizona English Language Learner Assessment (AZELLA) is a standards-based assessment that meets both state and federal requirements to measure students' English language proficiency. AZELLA is used for both placement and reassessment purposes. Students who have been identified as second language learners on the Home Language Survey take the AZELLA placement test, and the students' proficiency scores determine appropriate placement for instruction. Students who have been placed into an English language learner program will also take the AZELLA reassessment once per year until they achieve proficiency. Students who have scored proficient on the AZELLA are then monitored for two years to help ensure success after their move into a mainstream classroom.

AZELLA Placement Tests are Required

Students who are eligible for a Placement Test must be administered a Placement Test:

- When in-person learning is taking place at the school
- Virtual learning students once the district/school determines it is safe to bring students to an official district/school building to administer the test (this can be by appointment) and the parent(s) feel comfortable to bring their student in for testing





AZELLA Placement Tests




Students who are eligible to be administered the AZELLA Placement Test

- Incoming Kindergarten students and **new-to-AZ** students
 - Must have a language other than English and American Sign Language (ASL) on their Home Language Survey
- Most recent AZELLA record shows an EL Status as "Undetermined"
- Students who should have been administered the Spring 2020 Reassessment but could not due to school closures and DOES NOT have a 2019-2020 Placement test record
- Students who have a (red font) message on their EL70 Report indicating they need a new Placement Test
- Students who are listed as **EL Group 8** on the EL73 Report

An AZELLA test history supersedes an all-English HLS – you must review students' EL70 Reports!





Safe & Secure Test Administration



AZELLA Placement Test Administration Guidance for the 2020 – 2021 School Year

All AZELLA tests **MUST** be administered **in-person** in a secure test environment at the official district office and school buildings ensuring test validity and reliability.

Starting August 17, districts had to make local decisions based on the health metrics as to when they met or will meet the benchmarks to safely bring students into the school campuses for different purposes, including AZELLA testing.

Schools should be following CDC guidelines, the *ADHS Re-opening Benchmarks*, and your District's COVID-19 policies and protocols while maintaining a secure test environment and **following all** test security policies and procedures.







KPT Administration – Dec. 15



The Kindergarten Placement Test (KPT) is designed to measure the English language proficiency of **beginning** kindergarten students. Therefore, when a student has been enrolled in a kindergarten program in Arizona for a few months, the KPT is no longer an appropriate test to determine if the student has a language acquisition need.

Eligible kindergarten students who have been in school during the fall months but have not been administered the KPT prior to **December 15**, must wait until February and be administered the **Stage I Spring 2021 AZELLA Reassessment Test**.

This does NOT mean that districts have until December 15 to administer the KPT. All eligible kindergarten students should be administered the KPT as soon as practicable.

Eligible students in Grades 1-12 also need to be administered the Placement Test as soon as practicable. **Unlike the KPT**, the Stages II-V Placement tests are appropriate for (Placement) administration throughout the school year.







Accommodations

EL/SPED

Students who are eligible for an AZELLA Placement Test, regardless of disability, are required to be administered the test.

• The *Universal Test Administration Accommodations* are available for students. Utilizing any of these accommodations **does not** require ADE approval.

 The AZELLA Accommodations for Students with Disabilities are available to students with a current IEP or 504 Plan. These are pre-approved by ADE. These accommodations MUST be included in the student's IEP or 504 Plan for daily instruction and explicitly for the AZELLA state assessment.

• Not all accommodations are appropriate for the AZELLA test. When the student has accommodations included in their IEP or 504 Plan for daily instruction and state assessments that ARE NOT pre-approved by ADE for AZELLA, then the **AZELLA Additional Accommodations Request Form** must be submitted online. ADE reviews and responds to all submissions.



Spring 2021 AZELLA **Reassessment**

Test Window:

February 1 – March 19, 2021

Start testing as early in the window as possible! Please don't wait.





- ✓ Stage II (Grades 1– 2) Paper Administration with telephone Speaking test
- ✓ Stage III (Grades 3 5) Online Administration
- ✓ Stage IV (Grades 6 8) Online Administration

✓ Stage V (Grades 9 – 12) – Online Administration





Basics Steps to Create New ELP (AZELLA) Tests

- 1. New ELP Standards are adopted by the State School Board
- 2. New test design, passages, and test questions are developed to measure the 2019 ELP Standards
- 3. 2021 Stand-Alone Field Tests are administered to all AZ ELs
- 4. Data from the Stand-Alone Field Test is analyzed and used to create the new AZELLA Tests.
- 5. New AZELLA Tests are implemented with the Spring 2022 Reassessment Test and then the 2022-2023 Placement Test



2019 ELP Standards Leads to New AZELLA Tests



- ✓ Concurrent with 2021 Spring Reassessment
- ✓ Aligned to the 2019 ELP Standards
- Administered to all English Learners of Arizona
- ✓ New Test Design
- ✓ New grade configuration
- ✓ Test forms assigned by school
- \checkmark Shorter than the operational test
- ✓ Three Test Units



Grade Configuration and Mode of Administration
















Grades 2 – 3 Online Multiple – Choice Practice Items in TestNav8
