



# Summary of Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP) Operations During COVID-19

- SFAs may begin distributing FFVP foods when classes officially begin
- FFVP sites may continue to operate FFVP no matter if they choose to operate NSLP or SFSP/SSO
- FFVP sites that are operating NSLP may only serve FFVP to students enrolled in the FFVP approved school
- FFVP sites that are operating SFSP/SSO as an open site are able to serve FFVP to any child that attends that site
- FFVP sites may serve fresh fruits and vegetables to students at the time operators determine to be appropriate (may be outside the regular school day)
- FFVP sites may serve fresh fruits and vegetables in a non-congregate setting, including through home delivery
- FFVP sites may provide the FFVP service alongside other Child Nutrition Program meals (i.e., NSLP, SBP, SFSP, SSO, At-Risk, etc.)
- FFVP sites are encouraged (but not required) to provide nutrition education
- FFVP sites that are providing multiple days of meals at one time also may provide multiple servings of FFVP foods at one time
- The FFVP serving for a week must reflect what would be served to an individual student during a school week
- FFVP sites may distribute FFVP foods to a parent or guardian to take home to their children. To opt-in to this waiver SFAs must complete the following form one time for their district/charter:
