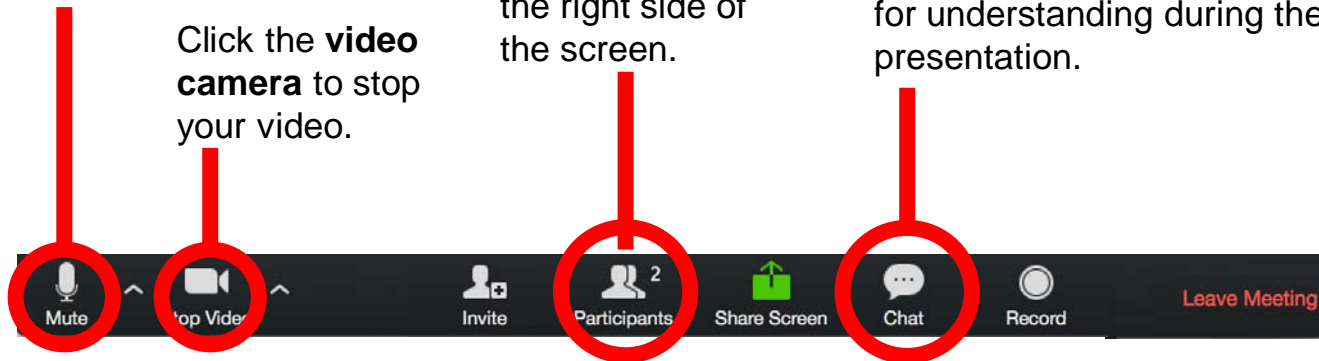

# Three Concepts Of Supplement Not Supplant

# What is Supplement Not Supplant (SNS)

- Foundation for allowability for Title III funds
- Title III SNS is strictest of all Title funds
- Supplement = to add to
- Supplant = not to replace

Ask yourself – “In the absence of Title III funds...

...is my LEA **required** to do this?”

...is this **already being provided** with other funds?”



# Understanding SNS

## **Concept 1: Consider legal obligations under other laws**

- Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Equal Educational Opportunities Act of 1974
  - LEAs must ensure that EL students can participate meaningfully and equally in educational programs
  - LEAs must identify, assess, monitor and provide language services to eligible EL students
  - LEAs must have qualified EL teachers, staff, and administrators to effectively implement their EL program
- Title I
- SEI Models

Keep it simple: If another law requires it, Title III CAN'T fund it!

# Check for Understanding – Sample 1

**LIAP Description:** ABC Elementary District has recently experienced a large influx of EL students. This increased demand has proportionately affected the amount of time the EL Coordinator spends ensuring a high quality and effective EL program. # Sample 1 Discussion

**LIAP Description:** ABC Elementary District has recently experienced a large influx of EL students. This increased demand has proportionately affected the amount of time the EL Coordinator spends ensuring a high quality and effective EL program. This part-time (.50 FTE) EL Coordinator will be increased to a full-time position (1.0 FTE) to meet the growing needs of the program and the increase in the EL student population. This additional .50 FTE will allow the EL Coordinator more time to maintain comprehensive records of AZELLA test history and proficiency levels, review student data to ensure proper program placement, update cumulative files, and send parent notification and Reassessment results.

This is not allowable under Title III. The highlighted duties are required under other Federal and State laws. In the absence of Title III funds, LEAs would still be required to perform these duties.

# Understanding SNS

## **Concept 2:** Consider your EL students as VIPs

- EL students must have equal access to the same programs and services provided to all students through other funding sources
- EL students are entitled to programs and services ABOVE AND BEYOND what they should already have access to and what non-ELs receive
- Title III funds do not provide MORE OF THE SAME
- Title III provides a supplemental funding source for LEAs to meet the unique challenges associated with instructing and supporting ELs

Additionally, success of the Read2Learn program used for general education students has prompted the EL Department to consider this software for use with EL students at the pre-emergent proficiency level. Read2Learn will assist ELs with improved language development because of its strong emphasis on listening, speaking and reading skills. Title III funds will be used to purchase technology devices (Chromebooks or iPads) for students identified and enrolled in EL services. Title III funds will also be used to purchase the Read2Learn program to be used on these devices. No other district students will have access to these devices or these software licenses purchased with Title III; these are for the exclusive use of ELs.

This not allowable under Title III. The highlighted items are provided to all students, and ELs are also part of the general population. ELs are entitled to have access to goods and funds made available for all students and, therefore, this is supplanting.

# Understanding SNS

## **Concept 3: Support for parents of EL students**

- Parents of ELs are secondary beneficiaries of Title III funds to allow them additional opportunities to support language development of their EL children
- *EL parents* are not the same as *parents of ELs*
- Parents of ELs have a civil right to receive information and communication which all parents receive and in a language they can understand

# Sample 3 Discussion

During these assembly-type events, parents and families of EL students are asked to attend the session with the EL Coordinator where they can learn more about the EL program and discuss specific needs and challenges their EL children may be experiencing. The EL Coordinator is bilingual, so the EL session also gives the non-English speaking parents the chance to ask questions and receive EL – specific support they may not get in the larger, schoolwide group. Title III funds will be used to compensate the EL Coordinator to facilitate these meetings outside her regular contracted hours.

This is not allowable under Title III. The highlighted portion shows parents of English learners are being separated at a schoolwide event. This denies them access to information which is brought to the attention of all parents. They have a civil right to equal participation at events offered for the whole school community.

# SEI Budget Facts

- Incremental costs
  - Teacher salaries/benefits only
- 12-month grant with no carryover
  - Project period July 1 through June 30
- Offsets factor into LEA award amount
  - Funding for justified FTE minus Group B and EL Deseg



# Adopting a 3-Year Mindset

# Understanding Overlapping Projects

- Timelines for 3 fiscal years are overlapping.
- Remember that grants and plans are constantly evolving.
- Needs can continue beyond 1 fiscal year.
- Title III project period is 15 months, not limited to one school year.
- Projects for 2 or 3 different fiscal years may be happening simultaneously.

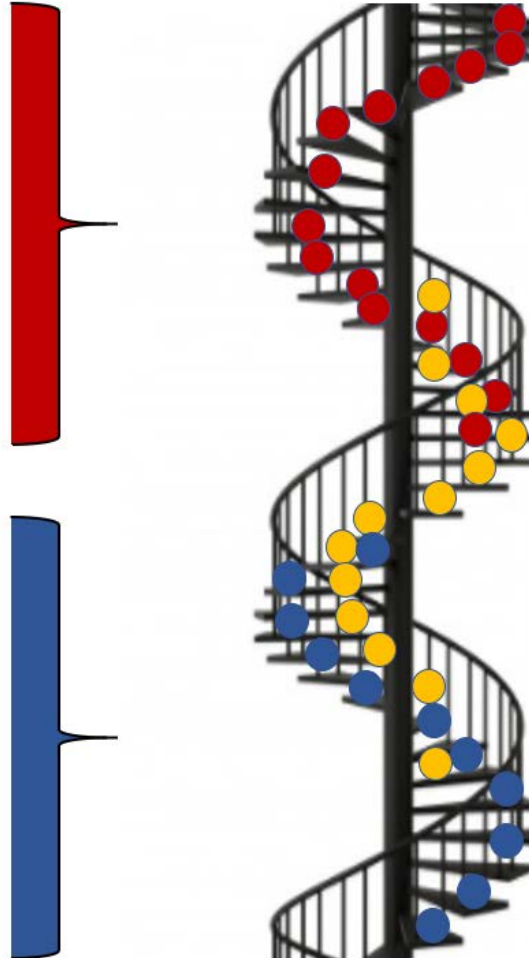

# Substantial vs. Director Approval

## **Substantial approval is:**

- the time stamp for when an LEA may begin to obligate funds

## **Director approval is:**

- actual approval of goods, services, and expenditures requested in the budget
- confirmation that grant expenditures are reasonable, allowable and allocable
- confirmation that LIAP is in “saved” status and aligns with grant requests
- the beginning of reimbursement request process

- LEAs doing REMARKABLE job with new planning tool in GME aligning to Funding Application
- Even amid the COVID-19 chaos, Title III applications have been so much cleaner and easier to approve
