PTI FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION

Arizona's Parent Training and Information Center (PTI) provides special education training and assistance to families of children with disabilities from birth through high school.

Every state has at least one center funded through the U.S. Department of Education under Part D of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).



IDEA 2004

- Part D--NATIONAL ACTIVITIES TO IMPROVE EDUCATION OF CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES
 - Section 671—Parent Training and Information Centers
 - (b) Required Activities.
 - (1) Provide training and information that meets the needs of parents of children with disabilities living in the area served by the center, particularly underserved parents and parents of children who may be inappropriately identified

Required Activities

- (4) assist parents to—
 - (B) communicate effectively and work collaboratively with personnel responsible for providing special education, early intervention services, transition services and related services;
 - (C) participate in decision making processes and the development of individualized education programs under part B and individualized family service plans under part C;
 - (F) participate in activities at the school level that benefit their children;

Required Activities (cont.)

- (6) assist parents in resolving disputes in the most expeditious and effective way possible, including encouraging the use, and explaining the benefits, of alternative methods of dispute resolution, such as the mediation process described in section 615(e); -
- (8) assist parents to understand the availability of, and how to effectively use, **procedural safeguards** under this title, including the resolution session described in section 615(e) -
- (9) assist parents in understanding, preparing for, and participating in, the process described in section 615(f)(1)(B); -

(c) Optional Activities

• --A parent training and information center...may provide information to teachers and other professionals to assist the teachers and professionals in improving results for children with disabilities.

Training Health Care Professionals



2017: **98%** Physicians reported training improved ability to communicate with families **N= 57**

- Staff presentations and parent panels

Parent to Parent Mentoring

Individual mentoring and coaching for 8 weeks

- Confidential
- Open eligibility
- Offered at no charge
- Available in Spanish
- Monitored and evaluated at 2, 4, and 8 weeks



Parent to Parent Program

- Upon request, Parent Leaders are matched with families facing a new concern
- Parent Leaders offer support and guidance
- Provides opportunities to share personal experiences and the perspective of a family who has faced similar issues



Impact of Parent to Parent Support

- Increases families' ability to cope
- Supports families in problem solving
- Develops awareness of community support



Parent Leadership Development

Prospective parent leaders are identified and recruited by Raising Special Kids staff and have demonstrated resiliency and effective advocacy skills for children.

Parent Leader Training includes these learning objectives:

- Confidentiality
- Accountability
- Professionalism
- Ethics
- Building from strengths
- Telling their story



Parent Leader Activities



- Parent to Parent Mentoring
- Parent Panels
- Community outreach events
- Systems level advisory groups, councils and committees
- Policy Development and review
- Public speaking, media interviews
- Training curriculum and materials preparation

Organization response to COVID-19

- Raising Special Kids staff continue to work from home
- In person workshops and trainings for all audiences were cancelled as of March 12, 2020 until further notice
- Intensive individual assistance provided by phone or online conferencing
- Defer requests for in-person training or outreach events
- In-person meetings with community partners and professionals are changed to phone or online conferencing

Organizational shift

- Not unlike the shift that schools and districts made in March, but on a smaller scale.
 - Developed technology for providing online training and outreach
 - Created unique messaging for families of children with disabilities and special health care needs
 - We are all in this together
 - This situation is something that likely none of us have ever experienced
 - It is okay to not be perfect, doing the best we can for our family is all that anyone can ask
 - Leaned-in to Social Media to push out accurate information
 - Mobilized staff and volunteers for individual outreach
 - Started calling families 'how are things?'
