A.R.S.15-708 – Notification Requirement to Parents on not proficient AzM2 Math assessment - **Not required for fall 2020**

Due to statewide summative ELA and Mathematics assessments being cancelled due to the pandemic, the parent notification letter regarding not proficient status on the spring 2020 AzM2 is not required. A.R.S. 15-708 requires LEAs to provide parents with written notice that includes;

1. What the student's mathematics deficiencies were on the Spring 2020 AzM2 math exam and;
2. How those deficiencies are being addressed through services provided to the students, which could include supplemental instruction and any supporting programs designed to address the student's specific mathematics deficiencies.

A.R.S. 15-708 states that the notification letter to parents include results from the spring 2020 AzM2. Since state level testing did not occur in the spring 2020, sending a letter to parents based on individual assessment results cannot be completed for the 2020-2021 school year.

LEAs should use data from previous years to identify students who are struggling and provide supports to best meet their needs.

Last year the Governor signed HB 2625 into law. This law


