Specifically, 1/2 cup vegetable was served on Thursday during the review period and also on the day of review and this did not meet the daily required minimum amount of 3/4 cup vegetable. Additionally, only 3/8 cup vegetable was served on Friday during the review period and this did not meet the daily required minimum amount of 3/4 cup vegetable.
