FAQ from 1/20/21 Education Leaders Call

- 1. What is the importance of these (statewide annual) assessments?
 - a. The ESSA reauthorization affirms the importance of statewide assessment as a way to provide annual measures of student progress.
 - b. The requirements for assessment models under ESSA include:
 - i. producing an annual summative determination of grade-level achievement aligned to state standards,
 - ii. measuring a student's academic proficiency based on challenging state academic standards for the grade in which the student is enrolled,
 - iii. allowing for disaggregated assessment data (by gender, racial and ethnic group, disability status, etc.) and individual score reports, and
 - iv. providing understandable information to parents, including those with disabilities or limited English proficiency.
- 2. What if parents refuse to send in for in-person testing?
 - a. The federal government has not provided any waivers for FY20 assessments. Therefore, all LEAs are federally required to implement assessments *to the best of their ability as public health conditions permit*.
- 3. In what way then are these tests considered valid if the context changes with how the students have learned?
 - a. Context will be considered in evaluating and analyzing data from the FY20 annual assessments.
- 4. For virtual schools, we are facing challenges securing testing locations. Hotels and other locations are not allowing us to bring in a larger number of students. How do test if we do not have testing locations for students?
 - a. ADE would recommend bringing in small numbers of students for assessment, in order to provide the most effective mitigation efforts.
 - b. Costs associated with needing multiple testing locations or testing days can be paid for from ESSER funds.
- 5. We have students on 10-month distance learning programs using outside of district curriculums; do we have to bring them in for testing as well?
 - a. Yes, all students enrolled should participate in the annual statewide assessment.

- 7. If families don't feel safe or the health metrics call for us to continue to be virtual, is there a plan B for assessments?
 - a. Annual assessments must be provided in-person. While some are delivered on a computer, they are not web-based. Therefore, there are no options for them to be delivered at home or virtually. This is not unique to Arizona's assessments and is the same with SAT, ACT, and the GED.
- 8. Is an assessment/ instructional model to be aligned with the health guidance?
 - a. Public health guidance should inform an LEAs instructional and assessment model/plan.
- 9. Any ideas on the turnaround for ESSER application approval?
 - a. ADE is poised for a quick turn-around on the ESSER 2 applications, as we have the system in place from ESSER 1.
- 10. Do we know allocation formulation for non title schools and thank for all the support of ADE and Superintendent Hoffman's office.
 - a. We have not made a decision on ESSER II allocation for non-Title I, but aiming to have more info for the field by next week.
