 - i. An inspiring true story of hope and survival, this is the testimony of a boy who was imprisoned in Auschwitz, Gross-Rosen and Buchenwald and recorded his experiences through words and color drawings.

 - i. Memoir of life in the ghetto and camps, from the viewpoint of the teenage author.
 - d. The Children of Willesden Lane: A True Story of Hope and Survival During World War II, Golabek, Mona, Little Brown Books for Young Readers, 2017
 - i. One of 10,000 Jewish children sent to England by fearful parents at the dawn of WWII, aspiring pianist Lisa Jura was 14 when her family put her on a Kindertransport train in Vienna.
