News & Fun Facts – October 1 Enrollment




ADE released the public October 1 report for Fiscal Year 2021 (2020-2021 School Year) on March 2nd. The current report and previous reports can be can be viewed on Accountability's <u>Data Page</u>. The October 1 Enrollment public file includes deduplicated counts of students enrolled on October 1st, 2020. In this issue of The Grader, we have provided some of the overall trends between the last two years:

- Enrollment numbers are down in general, especially in Preschool and Kindergarten, while slightly up in 11th and 12th grades
- About 1,112,598 students were enrolled in non-private Arizona schools as of October 1, 2020
- Charter are up approximately 18,000 or 9% higher than last year
- Traditional districts are down about 55,000 or 6% lower than last year
- Maricopa County had the smallest percent decrease in enrollments (around -2.45%)



The following graph and table show the percentage decreases in each county between Fiscal Year 2021 (2020-2021 school year) and Fiscal Year 2020 (2019-2020 school year).

In addition, there has been a higher level of student mobility this year as compared to previous years in analyzing entry and withdrawal codes.

Keep in mind that schools must apply every year to be considered for Alternative School status, even if they have been previously approved. Pupil Withdrawal Monitoring Update

This past month ADE began the first year of Pupil Withdrawal Monitoring. The schools were selected from across Arizona and represent urban, suburban, and rural schools. Selected schools were a mix of traditional district schools and charter schools, as well as both large and small schools. We want to thank these schools and districts personally for their tireless work in tracking down Pupil Withdrawal Forms and other documentation for their sampled withdrawn students. Because this is the first year of this program, ADE is already working on refining both the monitoring and the Pupil Withdrawal process itself.

One of these refinements is the creation of a new withdrawal code: W41/S41. This code was created to address the common situation when a student's parent withdraws the student from school, but the school has not yet received a records request from the new school. Under the current pupil withdrawal system, that student should be withdrawn as a W4/S4, which is also used to denote a student has had unexcused absences for 10 consecutive days. Documentation for a W41/S41 will include written communication with a parent about the intention to withdraw a student and enroll them in another school or district. This new code will be implemented for the next school year and will be part of an updated Pupil Withdrawal Form.

As the pupil withdrawal monitoring process continues, we expect to be able to make and announce other improvements to this process.





A-F Update

This past month the State of Arizona passed two important pieces of legislation that impacts Accountability for the 2020-2021 school year:

- **HB 2402**: This Bill enacts a one-year moratorium on issuing school A-F letter grades. The bill does not waive testing requirements for schools this year and requires SBE to identify low performing schools. We should note that even though Schools will not receive letter grades this year, data is still required to be collected and achievement components reported publicly.
- **HB 2301:** This Bill permanently excludes CTEDs from receiving a A-F letter grade.

The Grader will continue to update the field should other Accountability related legislation pass as well as provide any finalized updates for Federal Accountability.
