- **FY22 Title III** applications are now open in GME. The targeted submission due date for FY22 Title III applications is May 1, 2021. To find your allocation, please visit the <u>FY 2022 Title III Allocations List.</u>
- **FY21 Title III** project ends September 30, 2021. Please ensure you are submitting revisions, as necessary, before the project ends.
- **Reimbursement Requests are lagging!** Don't risk letting funds in any project expire. Please submit regular and frequent reimbursement requests for **all** your funding through GME. Please check with the Program Area of each grant to answer any questions you may have.
- **FY22 Migrant Education Program** applications are now open in GME. The targeted submission due date for FY22 Migrant Education Program applications is May 1, 2021. To find your allocation, please visit the <u>FY22 Allocations</u> list.

Thank you to all district staff who have assisted with administering the AZELLA Reassessment. Your hard work and dedication to complete these assessments is appreciated. Below are the updated numbers for Spring 2021 AZELLA Reassessment tests:

- Total tests completed: **38,908**
- Approximately 46% of eligible students have been administered the Reassessment
- There are an additional **13,800** online tests in progress
- Districts have **9 more weeks** to complete test administration
