

Arizona Department of Education COVID-19 Recovery Funds: CARES, CRRSA and American Rescue Plan (ARP) Acts



\$4 billion through Education Stabilization Fund (ESF) programs to support local and statewide COVID-19 recovery efforts

NEW LEA ESSER III Plan Requirements

- USED released a new Interim Final Rule (IFR) for ESSER III on 4/22/2021, and has released more information and guidance regarding this IFR in the past weeks
- The IFR provides more detail regarding the requirement for LEAs to develop a "Safe Return to In-Person Instruction Plan"
- The IFR also outlines new local ESSER III plan requirements that would need to be addressed by LEAs for their use of ESSER III funds



NEW: ESSER III Safe Return to In-Person Instruction Plan

All LEAs receiving ESSER III funds must develop and make publicly available on their website, not later than 30 days after receiving an ESSER III allocation, a plan for the safe return to in-person instruction and continuity of services. The plan would need to be created in an approachable format for parents and the community

The plan must address the following sections:

- How it will maintain the health and safety of students, educators, and other staff and the extent to which it has adopted policies, and a description of any such policies, on regarding safety recommendations established by the CDC (such as Universal and correct wearing of masks; Modifying facilities to allow for physical distancing; Handwashing and respiratory etiquette; Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation; etc.)
- II. How it will ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address students' academic needs and students' and staff social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services
- III. The plan must be updated regularly at least every 6 months, or more often depending on updates in CDC guidance through September 30, 2023. Public input must be sought when revisions are made
- IV. If an LEA already developed a plan prior to enactment of the American Rescue Plan Act that meets the statutory requirements, but does not address all the requirements on the previous slide, the LEA must revise and post its plan no later than 6 months after receiving its ESSER III funds to meet these requirements



NEW: ESSER III LEA ESSER III Plan Requirements

There are new requirements for LEAs to develop local plans for their use of ESSER III funds. While these elements will be included as part of the GME ESSER III application, the plan would also need to be publicly available on the LEA website and created in an approachable format for parents and the community

The plan must include the following elements:

- How the LEA will spend its 80% discretionary funds
- How the LEA will use the new 20% required set-aside funds to increase learning opportunities for vulnerable populations of students
- How the LEA will ensure that the interventions it implements, including but not limited to the 20% required setaside interventions to address the academic impact of lost instructional time, will respond to the academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs of all students, and particularly for our most vulnerable populations of students
- The extent to which and how the funds will be used to implement prevention and mitigation strategies that are, to the greatest extent practicable, consistent with the most recent CDC guidance on reopening schools, in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning



LEAs must engage in meaningful consultation with stakeholders (defined in the IFR), and provide the public the opportunity to provide input and take such input into account in the development of their plan

NEW: ESSER III General Timeline & Sequencing

Notice of ESSER III Allocations and Opening of LEA Application by May 24, 2021

Safe Return for In-Person Instruction Plan

- If <u>no plan</u> was in place, then it would need to be created by July 2, 2021
- If a plan was already in place, then the plan would need to be revised to address the new requirements to be in place for the first day of the next school year (SY21-22)
- Update at least every 6 months, or more often depending on updates in CDC guidance - through September 30, 2023



Key Takeaways

- ESSER III includes new required set asides for both ADE and LEA. These will help guide state and local decision making for leveraging these new funds to accelerate and enrich learning and increase learning opportunities – particularly for our most vulnerable populations
- ADE has created a strategic planning and budgeting process grounded in stakeholder engagement and collaboration to identify how to best leverage SEA set aside funds to support statewide recovery needs in alignment with our agency's strategic plan, mission and vision
