

# **Barriers to Equity**

- Still learning the English language



# Benefits of Focusing on Equity

- Improved test scores
- Strengthening of a student's health and social emotional development
- Longer life
- Economic growth



# Levels of Equity

### The <u>Every Student Succeeds Act from 2015</u> <u>suggests three levels of equity exist in</u> every school:

- 1. **Institutional** What the district and school administration value, and the policies they put in place.
- 2. **Personal** How teachers engage with the complicated emotional and cognitive processes needed to work towards equity.
- 3. Instructional Any books, lesson plans, assignments or teaching strategies you use in the classroom.



# Creating Equitable Environments

### Meaningful Equity in the Classroom

- Start with yourself
- <u>Model</u> equity for your students
- Be <u>flexible</u> with online learning
- <u>Address</u> in appropriate remarks
- Accommodate <u>different learning</u> <u>styles</u>
- Examine your teaching materials
- Give students <u>a voice</u>






### **Creating an Equitable Environment**

### **Explore Independently**

- Independently, if you are interested and have time, read <u>THIS white paper</u> by the Achievement Network on expanding equity to all students as we work to re-open our schools after the COVID-19 pandemic.
- This article addresses creating schools where every student can thrive through equity, academics and social emotional learning.





### **Everyone as Partners**

- Students, parents, family members, and even other teachers are partners in ensuring any student's success.
- Learning happens most effectively when everyone works together as partners
- In conversations, listen often; learn from others' points of view
- Develop plans for improvement together
- Follow up regularly





### **Building Community**

- Infuse exercises that involve connectedness
  - Stretch together, play music, take collective breaths, play an icebreaker game to encourage sharing
- Let everyone play a role
- Embrace questions
- Practice the art of listening





### **Building Community Strategies**

- Set challenges
- Ask your students for feedback
- Bring in guest speakers
- Create a safe space for sharing
- Hold live events
- Set expectations early on






Strategies to Implement Immediately

### What is a Playlist?


- A playlist is a teaching strategy that allows student choice over the order and content of learning.
- It is an excellent example of student centered learning and differentiating instruction.
- It is a common practice in blended learning settings (Individual Rotation) but also works well fully online.




### What is a Hyperdoc?

A HyperDoc is a digital document where all components of a unit have been pulled together into one central document.

### Benefits:

- → Fewer lectures
- → More face-to-face-interaction
- $\rightarrow$  Flexibility
- → Multimodal







### What is the Flipped Classroom?


The Flipped Classroom model flips the traditional relationship between class time and homework. Students learn at home via online/asynchronous coursework and teachers use class time for their teacher guided practice.





### Implementing the Flipped Classroom


- <u>Decide where your videos will</u> <u>come from</u>
- <u>Decide how and when your</u> <u>students will use the videos</u>
- <u>Find other uses for the</u> <u>instructional videos</u>
- Hold your kids accountable
- Complement with guided lessons





### What is Station Rotation?

The **Station Rotation** model allows students to **rotate** through **stations** on a fixed schedule, where at least one of the **stations** is an online learning **station**. This model is most common in elementary schools because teachers are already familiar **rotating** in "centers" or **stations**.





### **Benefits of Station Rotation**

- Small group instruction
- Allows for differentiation
- Tech station can give formative data
- Students working at own pace
- Balance online and offline work
- Considerations:
  - Time Management
  - Staying at your teacher led station
  - Expectations at each station
  - Students being able to problem solve independently








