The Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) Meal Benefit Income Eligibility Forms required for annual participant enrollment are now available. Please discontinue use of the previous forms and begin providing participants or guardians with new forms and information. The enclosed Income Guidelines, Frequently Asked Questions, Instructions, and Meal Benefit Income Eligibility Forms are to be used from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022.

The Arizona Department of Education (ADE) recommends sponsors begin utilizing the new documents to complete the annual income eligibility process as soon as possible. The pages are designed to be printed double-sided on 8½” by 11” paper and are available in English and Spanish.
