Menu Planning

Fluid milk was not available in at least two varieties for each meal service. This was attributed to the learning plan not allowing for milk choice at each meal service; however, a meal pattern waiver was not submitted.

Discussed variety requirement and feasible options for compliance (e.g., incorporating milk variety into mobile service or submitting a waiver). Allowable milk varieties are fat-free unflavored, fat-free flavored and 1% unflavored. Please note that repeated violations involving milk requirements may result in fiscal action and/or termination of performance-based reimbursement (extra 7 cents).

Please submit a meal pattern waiver to ADE describing the justification for not offering two varieties of milk during breakfast and lunch for the timeframe of mobile meal service.

Quantities observed on the day of review did not meet minimum amounts required by the meal pattern. Specifically, daily meat/meat alternate requirements were not met at lunch. A 2-ounce ham patty crediting as only 0.75 oz eg of meat/meat alternate was served when 1 oz eq of meat/meat alternate is required daily at lunch for grades K-8. This was not a repeat finding from cycle two and did not contribute toward fiscal action calculations.

Only 1/2 cup of fruit was provided on 4/12/21, 4/13/21, and 4/14/21 and only 1/4 cup of fruit utensils, offering additional fruits, was provided on 4/15/21 when 1 cup of fruit is required daily at breakfast for grades K-8. This was not determined to be a repeat finding from cycle two and did not contribute toward fiscal action calculations.

This was not determined to be a repeat finding from cycle two and did not contribute toward fiscal action calculations.

Quantities observed during the review period did not meet minimum amounts required by the meal pattern. Specifically, daily grain requirements were not met at breakfast on 4/15/21. Specifically, graham crackers crediting as 0.75 ounce equivalents were served with 1.0 ounce equivalents of cheese stick. Meat/meat alternates may not be counted toward the grain component at breakfast until after the minimum daily grains requirement (1.0 ounce equivalents) is offered. This was not determined to be a repeat finding from cycle two and did not contribute toward fiscal action calculations.

Specifically, only 1/4 cup fruit was provided when 1/2 cup of fruit is required daily at lunch utensils, offering additional fruits, for grades K-8. This was not determined to be a repeat finding from cycle two and did not contribute toward fiscal action calculations.

Only 1/8 cup of red/orange vegetable was provided throughout the week when 3/4 cup of red/orange vegetable is required requirements for the National School weekly at lunch for grades K-8 and only 1/4 cup of other vegetables was provided when 1/2 cup other vegetable is required weekly at lunch for grades K-8. This was not determined to be a repeat finding from cycle two and did not toward fiscal action calculations.

- Apple/orange was recorded "4 oz" portion as "1 ea." for crediting under fruit; 1 apple credits as 1 cup fruit and 1 orange credits as 1/2 cup fruit (breakfast 4/12/21)
- Cereal bar was recorded as 1.42 oz eq grain; credits as Programs Interactive Web-Based Tool 1 oz eq grain (breakfast 4/14/21) can be found at
- Whole-grain biscuit was recorded as 2-oz portion crediting at 1-2 oz eq grain; credits as 2.0 oz eq grain (breakfast 4/16/21)
- Egg patty was recorded as 1-1.5 oz eq meat/meat alternate (M/MA); sufficient crediting documentation was not available (breakfast 4/16/21)
- Cheese slices were recorded as 2 1-oz portions; portion size for sliced cheese was 0.5 ounces (breakfast on 4/16/21)
- Taco meat was recorded as 2-oz portion crediting as 2 oz eq M/MA; 2-oz portion credits as 1.25 oz eq M/MA (lunch 4/12/21)
- Shredded lettuce was recorded as 1-oz portion crediting as 1 ounce vegetable; 1-oz portion credits as 1/4 cup vegetable (lunch 4/12/21)
- Hamburger patty was recorded as a 3-oz portion crediting as 3 oz eq M/MA; 2.8-oz patty that credits as 2.0 oz eq M/MA was served (lunch 4/13/21)
- Hamburger buns were recorded as 1–2 oz eq grain; credits as 2.0 oz eq grain (lunch 4/13/21)
 - Bread was recorded as 2.5-oz portion crediting as "2-sl." grain; 2 slices crediting as 2.0 oz eq grain was served (lunch 4/14/21)
 - Ham was recorded as 1-oz portion crediting as "3-1 oz" M/MA; 1-oz portion credits as 0.75 M/MA (lunch 4/14/21)
 - Cheese was recorded as 1-oz portion crediting as "2-1 oz" M/MA; 1-oz portion credits as 1.0 oz eq M/MA (lunch 4/14/21)
 - Nacho chips were recorded as 15-ea. portion crediting as "15 ea." grain; 15-each portion credits as 1.5 oz eq grain (lunch 4/15/21)
 - Ground beef was recorded as 2-oz portion crediting as 2 oz eq M/MA; 2-oz portion credits as 1.25 oz eq M/MA (lunch 4/15/21)
 - Cheese pizza was recorded as a 3-oz portion crediting as 3 oz eq grain; 1-slice (4.60-oz) portion credits as 2.0 oz eq grain, 2.0 oz eq M/MA, and 1/8 cup vegetable (lunch on 4/16/21)
 - Breakfast loaf was recorded as a 2-oz portion crediting as 2.0 oz eq grain; credits as 1.0 oz eq grain (breakfast 5/20/21)
 - Fresh apple was credited in ounces instead of cups (breakfast 5/20/21)
 - Ham patty was recorded as 2-oz portion crediting as 2 oz eq M/MA; credits as 0.75 oz eq M/MA (lunch 5/20/21)
