Program Description, Industry Credential, Coherent Sequence, and Teacher Certification

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The **Electronic Technologies** instructional program prepares students to apply basic engineering principles and technical skills in support of electrical, electronics and communication engineers. Includes instruction in electrical circuitry, prototype development and testing, systems analysis and testing, systems maintenance, instrument calibration, and report preparation.

The **Electronic Technologies** instructional program is interwoven with practical and engaging activities and projects that repair, test, adjust, or install electronic equipment, such as industrial controls, transmitters, and antennas. Students completing the **Electronic Technologies** program will further understand advances in electronic technologies, energy bands with electronics, optical properties, and evolving nanotechnology related to circuits.

The **Electronic Technologies** Career and Technical Education program is delivered as a coherent sequence of courses designed to offer students knowledge and skills that meet the needs of the workplace. The Professional Skills developed by business and industry leaders across Arizona are integrated throughout the program. **Electronic Technologies** students develop leadership, social, civic, and career skills through participation in the state-recognized Career and Technical Student Organizations, SkillsUSA or FBLA (Future Business Leaders of America).

The **Electronic Technologies** instructional program prepares students for entry-level employment, further training, and/or post-secondary education for these and other occupations: An Instrumentation Technician, Electronic Bench Technician, Electronics Technician, Help desk technician, Test technician, and Electronics test technician
