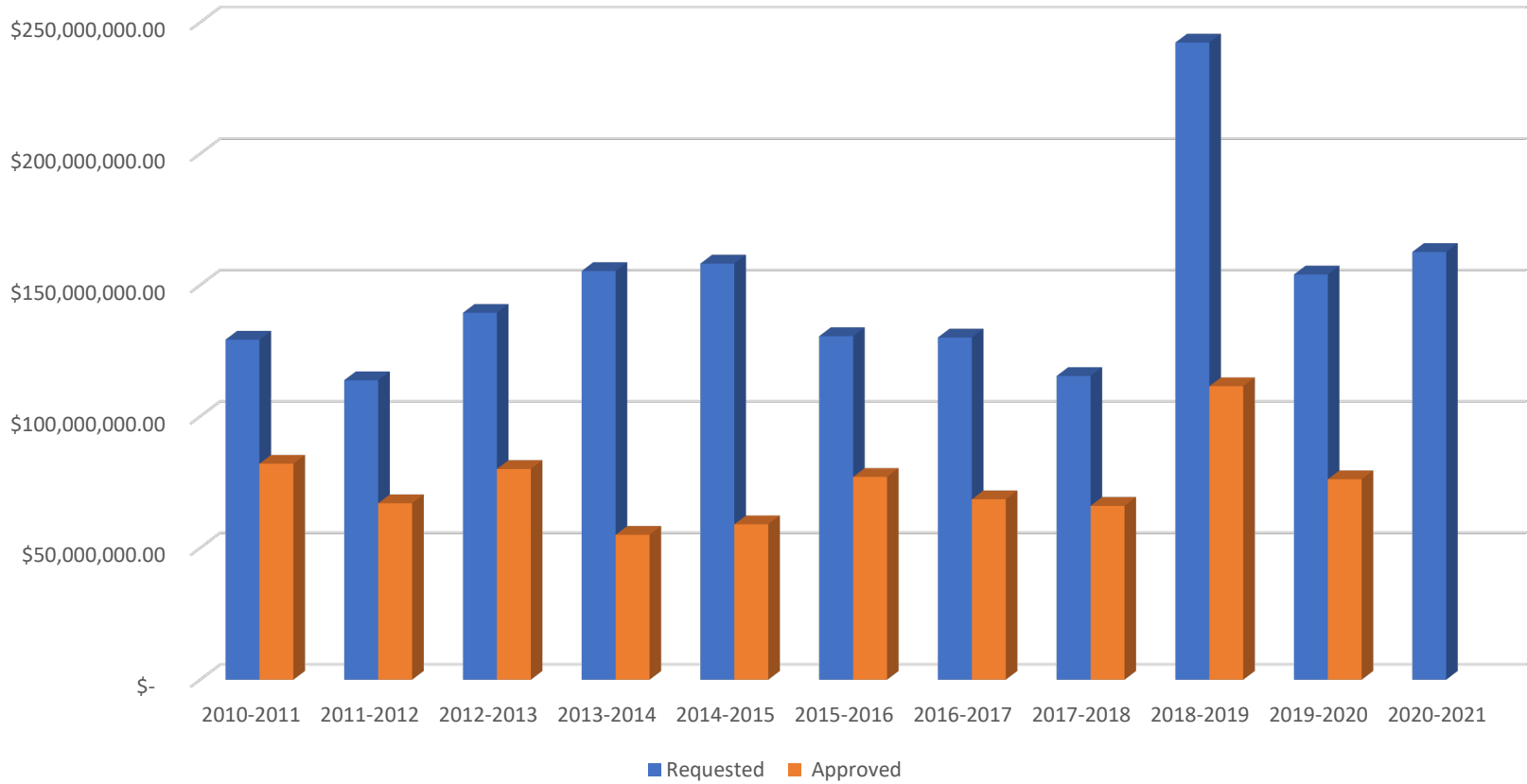
General Information

- How large are the discounts on eligible products and services?
 - Discounts: 20% to 90% of eligible costs (85% Max for Category 2)
 - Discount for a school or library depends on:
 - Percentage of eligibility of students for National School Lunch Program (NSLP) in:
 - (for a school) the school
 - (for a library) the school district in which the library is located
 - Urban or Rural location of the school or library <https://sltools.universalservice.org/portal-external/urbanRuralLookup/>
 - Be sure to check your BEN and correct any information that may be incorrect NOW.

 - Schools and School Districts
 - Libraries and Library Systems
 - Consortia
 - Charter Schools
 - Private Schools

Federal CAF Funding

Frontier (New fiber install)

- Dennehotso 41,000 feet
- Kaibito 192,000 feet
- Shonto 640,000 feet
- Sanostee 314,000 feet
- Toadlena 38,000 feet
- Rock Point 118,000 feet

Federal Erate Funding

- Erate funding
 - Chapter Houses / Libraries
 - 2021 - \$5.2M Approved to build fiber to 41 Chapter Houses across the Navajo Nation
 - Apache County
 - 2018 - \$8.3M
 - 2019 - \$1.3M
 - 2021 - \$2.1M

Service / Price

- The secret to obtaining reliable, cost effective services is competition!

Example: Yavapai County schools were paying an average of \$48 per meg for internet service. After we went through the bidding process, the price came down to \$3.48 per meg.

- 100M internet from \$4,800 per month to \$348 per month.
