AZ Leg Session Timeline

- Session began January 11th goes 100 days or until they sine die.
- Bills that have gone through committee and pass out of their chamber of origin cross over to the other chamber.
- Bills that have not made it on a committee agenda at this point are likely dead (although may show up as a striker/amendment or in the budget language).
- Bills will move through the opposite chambers in same process, going through committee and then floor.
- Budget negotiations will be on-going but are not usually not finalized until all the appropriation bills have moved through the process.
- Governor signs non-money bills along the way if they pass out of both chambers.

Assessments & Accountability – What's Happening

- HB 2402 signed into Arizona law -- paused letter grades, extended assessment window
- AZ Governor released an executive order for the State Board study
 AzM2 assessment data and compare to prior years
- AZM2 only available in person
- No blanket waiver from the federal government on assessment and accountability; and we don't anticipate this
- Some existing waivers on identifying additional schools for improvement
- Unclear what flexibilities will be available under Biden
 Administration @ US Department of Education
- ADE will evaluate all options to provide flexibility for administering assessments and keeping educators and students safe
