# **ESEA Consolidated Grant Updates**

### **FY22 Grant Timelines and Requirements**

It is hard to believe we are already moving into the 2022 fiscal year! The following reminders are important to note as we move into this new fiscal year.

• FY22 General Statement of Assurances (GSAs) are due March 1, 2021. The submission and acceptance of your GSA prior to the deadline ensures your organization will not be affected by a global hold (which prevents any fiscal action and approval of funding applications).

• Grant funding applications and budgets are due May 1, 2021. The timely submission of these documents and the above-mentioned GSA, followed by the appropriate approvals, will allow your organization to draw down funds as early as July 1, 2021.

• Funding applications must be in Director Primary Approved status before an LEA can begin to draw down funds; this includes the approval of all required documentation, i.e., Comprehensive Needs Assessment (CNA), Integrated Action Plan (IAP), Consultation Forms, etc. Please be reminded that these items will need to be completed prior to Director Approved status and the ability to draw down funds.

•ADE has provided guidance regarding the use of vendors/consultants when applying for grant funds. LEAs may use third-party vendors, but must remain the responsible sub-grantee and involved in the application process. The new guidance can be found <u>here</u>. User roles may need to be updated in Grants Management Enterprise (GME) system based on this new guidance. Information regarding user role access can be found <u>here</u>.

We understand that receiving grant funding is more important than ever. As a critical partner in the success of Arizona's schools, ADE is here to support you in this process.

**FYI - Important Due Dates:** Self-Assessment & General Statement of Assurances (GSA). Both requirements for FY22 are due 3/1/2021.

LEAs which have not had their GSAs accepted will have their applications placed on HOLD.

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March 1, 2021-June 30, 2021

#### Substantial Approval as per Alice Johnson

1. A Nightly process will apply Substantial Approval for ESEA Consolidated (entitlement) applications

- 2. This process will run March 1 June 30, 2021
- 3. Included in the process:
  - 1. Entitlement applications on the list provided with any budget amount.
  - 2. Above applications in LEA Authorized Representative Approved status
  - 3. Above applications with an accepted GSA

Perhaps your application may or may not be ready for a full review, but you would like to secure the *Substantial Approval* History Log comment.

If so, please reach out to your assigned program specialist to discuss moving your application forward to sit for 24 hours in LEA *Authorized Representative Approved* status. That way, the comment can be automatically be dropped from March 1 – June 30, 2021. This will ensure you can begin to obligate funds on July 1, 2021.

### Here is an example of a Sample Approval Comment:

**SAMPLE:** Per 34 CFR 76.708, your application has been submitted in a substantially approvable state. While you may begin obligating funds for Title II Improving Teacher Quality as of **07/01/2021**, reimbursement will not be available until the application is final Director Approved.

Substantial Approval will still be granted after July 1, 2021. Please note if that occurs, Program Specialists must select "Yes" in the Substantial Approval section per each program area in order for the History Log Comment to drop. The application must also be in *LEA Authorized Representative Approved* status for this to happen. The history log comment will reflect the date the Program Specialists selected "Yes."

### New Reporting Paints Picture of Arts Access in Arizona Schools

According to new the Arizona data reported by Department of Education and Arizona Commission on the Arts, 89% of K-12 students in the state have access to education in at least one arts discipline. Participation, however, dropped 5% between the 2018-19 and 2019-20 school years. These statistics are only two of the insights offered by the latest update to the state's Arts Education Data Project. The update comprises self-reported data from school districts and local education agencies across the state, representing nearly 2,000 schools, up through the 2019-20 school year. The new data is featured in both an <u>executive summary report and an interactive explorer.</u>

"The newly updated Arts Education Data Project is an incredible tool that helps highlight programs and classes that schools offer to students across our state," said Superintendent of Public Instruction Kathy Hoffman. "I am grateful to know that more and more of Arizona's students have access to opportunities to engage in the arts. Arts provide a necessary and unique outlet for our students to creatively express themselves and share their stories. I look forward to continuing to collaborate with the Arizona Commission on the Arts to highlight the importance of the arts for our students."

How is this dashboard being used? Each year, ADE is required to perform programmatic monitoring for our LEAs (Districts & Charters) that utilize federal funding (TI, TII, TIV-A, RLIS, etc.). NEW to this process is the "Arts Access Report." The Arts Access Report utilizes data entered into our dashboard to measure student access and enrollment in arts courses in comparison to state and federal requirements. More on this will be made available on our <u>Arts Education website</u>.
