

December HNS Communications Round-up

December Emails

December 17

Internal On-Site Monitoring Deadline

Internal on-site monitoring must be completed prior to February 1, 2022 for SFAs operating more than one site under the NSLP/SSO.

December 17

Submitting Income Eligibility I and II and FRL for FY22

ADE released a memo reminding LEAs of the requirement to report individual student income eligibility data.

December 20

Congressional Flexibilities Extended

Due to congressional action, the flexibility to allow low-fat, flavored milk in NSLP and SBP is extended through February 18, 2022.

January Emails (so far)

January 3 **Simplot Foods**

Beginning in SY 22-23, Simplot Foods will no longer be a participating processor for USDA Foods for school nutrition programs.

January 4 **US Foods Delaying Deliveries of USDA Foods**

Due to resource constraints and impacts of COVID-19, US Foods is delaying deliveries for this week and potentially next week.

Internal On-Site Monitoring

Internal On-Site Monitoring must be conducted prior to February 1!

If you are an SFA operating more than one site under the NSLP or SSO, you are required to conduct on-site reviews of the counting and claiming system and readily observable areas of review each year. The requirement includes breakfast (if applicable) and lunch!

- Each lunch site must be reviewed annually.
- Only 50% of breakfast sites must be reviewed annually.

<u>Child Nutrition Response #94</u> waives the on-site monitoring portion of this requirement; however, SFAs opting into this waiver must conduct the internal monitoring off-site and keep supporting documentation to fulfill the SY 21-22 requirement.

Income Eligibility I and II and FRL

Reminder: LEAs are required to submit student-level data in Arizona Education Data Systems (AzEDS)

HNS partnered with ADE's Student Achievement and Educator Excellence division to release the joint memo, <u>Submitting Income Eligibility I and II and FRL for Fiscal Year 2022</u>. This information is reminding LEAs who are operating NSLP or SSO of the requirement to report individual student income eligibility data in AzEDS. Student indicators may only be reported with supporting eligibility determinations from a school meal application, alternate Income Eligibility form (<u>English</u>)/(<u>Spanish</u>), or direct certification.

- SFAs operating a Special Provision Option (SPO) are not authorized to use school meal applications whatsoever. These schools may continue to collect this data through alternate income eligibility forms.
 - These forms cannot be processed using funds from the nonprofit school food service account.
- Many LEAs still need to submit their data to AzEDS for this year! The deadline to complete this task is, January 18, 2022.

- US Foods asks that SFAs check myFOODS accounts if you have orders scheduled for this week or next week. You will be contacted regarding these deliveries.
- Emergency procurement procedures can be implemented as outlined in SP 01-2022.



Verification for SY 21-22

Phase 4: Report

Nov 16-Feb 1: At this point, verification activities should be completed. The Verification Summary Report (VSR) became available in CNP Verification Reporting through ADEConnect on November 16.



All SFAs are required to submit a VSR!

- SSO operators
- NSLP operators
- Special Assistance Provision operators (Provision 2/3 and CEP)
- RCCIs






