Discussed Gilbert Unified District was Please provide the loan or forgiveness/gift not charged the full indirect cost rate. Sufficient allowed 20.80% of the direct cost base agreement for the remaining \$242,144.80. of \$5,971,850. The total allowable indirect was \$1,242,144.80. The actual indirect costs in the amount of \$1,000,000 or 16.75% of the direct cost base were recovered. Additionally, discussed the remaining cannot be collected in the future unless an agreement exists.
