Average Daily Membership (ADM) Growth

Average Daily Membership Growth

Regular ADM by Entity Type

District	876,752	859,621	2.0%
Charter	220,667	220,595	0.0%
Total	1,097,419	1,080,217	1.6%

Payment Updates



Gifted Group B Weight

 Funding for the new Group B weight for gifted students has been added to the May payment

- Funding appears as an adjustment to the base support level in BSA 55 Reports
- Adjustments will be finalized after statewide recalculation in July
- New gifted weight is expected to be implemented in payment system in FY 2023



Gifted Group B Weight

- 136 districts and charters representing about 70% of statewide ADM have reported at least one student that will generate gifted add-on funding
- Over 34,000 students have been reported with a qualifying gifted need
 - Approximately \$1 million total funding statewide

Gifted Group B Weight

New 0.007 funding weight added for FY 2022

- Limited to students that score at or above the 97th percentile on qualifying tests
 - Quantitative (Math) Giftedness
 - Language Arts (Verbal) Giftedness
 - Non-Verbal Reasoning Giftedness
- There is more information about reporting gifted students in the <u>September Hot Topic</u> on the School Finance website



- Updated allocations will be published, and the second payment distributed this month
 - First payment was made on 11/5

- Award amounts are based on FY 2019 assessment results and poverty measures, the same as in FY 2021
 - Updated student counts this year

Based on percentage of students passing FY 2019 assessments



- \$400 per student count:
 - Top 13% of higher poverty schools (60%+ FRL)
 - At least 42.50% average passing

- \$225 per student count:
 - Top 27% of higher poverty schools (60%+ FRL)
 - 36.00% to 42.50% average passing
 - Top 13% of all schools
 - At least 65.14% average passing



- Average passing:
 - Average of the percentage of all students passing all assessments English Language Arts and Mathematics
 - FY 2019 assessment data is available on the <u>Accountability & Research Data webpage</u>
- Poverty cohort based on the greater of:
 - % eligible for free or reduced-price lunch
 - % income eligibility 1 or 2 on 10/1/18
- Student Counts:
 - Prior year for districts, current year for charters



 New student-level report in AzEDS details the calculation of % eligible for free or reduced-price lunch

Proposition 123 Additional Funding

 Second payment of the \$75M additional funding from Proposition 123 will be distributed this week

- Funding is allocated based on districts' and charters' share of statewide student counts
 - Same student count used to allocate Classroom Site Fund
- Hot Topic on the School Finance website details the total funding and payment amounts for each district and charter

Budget Report Updates

BUDG25 Report

- BUDG25 reports have been updated for May payment data
- The reduction for any over expenditure in the FY 2021 BUDG75 has been included in the report
- BUDG75 reports have been updated to use carryforward from the FY 2021 Annual Financial Report
- REMINDER: Tuition amounts will be updated based on actual invoices prior to publishing FY 2022 BUDG75 reports in the fall






SECTION 4

Preparing for FY 2023

FY 2023 Budget Forms

- If the state budget passes on or before June 3rd, the Auditor General Office will publish final budget forms as soon as possible
- Auditor General Office will publish preliminary budget forms on June 3rd if the state budget has not passed and does not appear imminent
 - Revised forms will be available for revisions as soon as Friday, July 8th
 - Preliminary forms will not account for inflation or other changes





FY 2023 Payment Schedule

- Monthly basic state aid payment dates change beginning in FY 2023 (<u>Laws 2021</u>, <u>Chapter 404</u>)
- Payments will be made on the 15th business day of each month beginning in July
 - Previously the first business day of each month beginning in August
 - FY 2023 data capture and payment dates have been <u>published on our website</u>
