




Accountability

Accountability aims to measure the growth in quality of Arizona schools and districts by producing timely and reliable accountability determinations as required by state and federal law. We work closely with Assessments, the State Board of Education, and Research in order to accurately label schools in a fair and systematic manner. The Accountability staff supports schools, districts, and other stakeholders to refine the system as well as utilize data in an appropriate and effective manner.

The Data – It belongs to the Field

- All data from the district/school student management system is submitted to ADE through AzEDS
 - Data is collected and then run through integrity checks
 - Reports are generated that inform districts and schools if students passed the integrity check, if not, the reason for the error
 - If data does not pass integrity, districts and schools should correct the data and resubmit

Data Roadmap with Multiple Points of Failure

SCHOOLS, LEAS, VENDORS

Schools & LEAs with errors in data input, missing data, misinterpretation, instability of data requested

01

SIS & Vendor template data capture – input errors, multiple SIS systems, mis-interpretation, instability of data requested, system change lead time: interim

02

ADE

Errors related to data integrity or other controls, data processing failures, bugs, changing data needs with unachievable timelines / resource shortages; build vs buy introducing risk

03

Data collection tools as short term fixes resulting from time constraints; requirements with flawed analytical approaches; inconsistent role of business as data owner with IT as enabler

04

AUDIENCES

Conflicting communications; not understanding context of data

06

Interpretation errors (e.g., conflicts with definitions of variant data); data that is similar but created for different purposes with intentionally different business rules


Department of Education, subject to final adoption by the

Accountability Federal Models Identification Criteria / CSI-Low Achievement

K-8 Schools

Proficiency 60%
Growth 20% - 28%
EL (Achievement and growth) 10%
Chronic Absenteeism 10% - 2%

9-12 Schools

Proficiency 60% Graduation Rate 20% EL (Achievement and growth) 10% Drop-out 10%

Schools Serving a Combination to include Grade 12

Proficiency 60%
EL (Achievement and growth) 10%
Growth 15%
Chronic Absenteeism 5% - Removed
Graduation 5%

June	2021-2022 Initial Static File released
July	 Data Correction closes July 15th 2021-2022 A-F Self-Reporting Data application closes on ADEConnect
August	 Early August (Release V2) – This file will contain assessment results, assessment corrections submitted by July 30. This file needs to be reviewed for any issues regarding assessments Late August (Release V3) – The file will contain growth data Late August: School-level aggregated data available in ADEConnect Late August: Federal Identification (CSI, ATSI, TSI)
September	 September/October (Release V4) – This is the final version that would contain all updated information Initial cut score modeling
October	Cut score modeling approved
November	Letter Grades are published, and appeal window opens
December	Appeals for State Accountability finalized
