The SFA did opt into the Nationwide Waiver to Allow Specific School Meal Pattern Flexibility for School Year 2021-2022, however, they did not provide supporting documentation for utilizing the meal pattern waiver for serving non-whole grain rich items during breakfast (crackers, danish, muffin).

SFA indicated participating in the Nationwide Waiver to Allow Specific School Meal Pattern Flexibility for School Year 2021-2022 in their NSLP Sponsor application. Additionally, the SFA will need to provide supporting documentation for serving non-whole grain rich items at breakfast during the week of review.
