Performance Standard 2: Meal Components & Quantities - Critical Area

1 Fluid milk was not available in at least two varieties at breakfast during one day of the review period. This was determined to be a repeat finding attributed to supply chain disruptions and therefore did not contribute toward fiscal action calculations per USDA's COVID-19: Child Nutrition Response #100.
