



JOM Allowable Cost Checklist

- Is this cost related to an eligible JOM student's unique and specialized need?**
If all students have this need, another source of funding should be provided by the school or Tribe
- Is this cost an academic need?**
JOM funds are for academic support only. JOM funds cannot be used for Social Emotional Learning (SEL)
- Is this need funded by another program?**
JOM can supplement, not supplant other funding, and should not result in a decrease of other funding
- Is the cost based on identified student needs?**
- Is the cost based on the education plan documented in the GME* application?**
JOM funds can be used for JOM staff, eligible students, and IEC members.
- Is the cost reasonable?**

- Has the cost been approved by the Indian Education Parent Committee?**

- Has the Indian Education Parent Committee prioritized the cost to support the most students with the greatest academic needs?**
- Does the GME application identify how the cost assists students in achieving academic improvement?**
- If the cost is for food purchases, is it necessary to meet the program objectives?**
Need to make a compelling case to justify the use of Federal funds for food and beverages
- If the cost is for food purchases, have attempts been made to have all, or a portion of the food paid through alternative sources such as sponsorships or donations?**
