- ELA includes one writing and two reading test units. For Grade 3, an Oral Reading Fluency unit is also included. All ELA test units must be administered to receive an ELA score.
- Math includes two test units. Both Math test units must be administered to receive a Math score.
- Writing must be administered on a separate test day than Reading and Math.
- Reading and Math can be administered in any order, but no more than two test units plus the Oral Reading Fluency unit can be administered on a single day.
- When two test units are administered in a single day, a significant break must be given between test units. Test units must be completed on the day the unit is begun. **Do not start the test unit unless there is sufficient time to complete the testing session.**
- Once a test unit is begun, students may not take a break for lunch. During the test unit, students may only leave the room for a restroom break, visit to the nurse's office, or for emergency purposes.

	New this year: Schools may utilize both published state ACT test windows in order to assess all Cohort 2024 students. Schools are encouraged to administer ACT during the first test window and may also use the second test window, as needed, to complete any makeup testing. Schools administering ACT on paper may also use the online test dates for makeup testing. Any schools that choose to administer the ACT during only the second test window will not have an additional ACT test window to use for makeup testing. Test window selection will be made in ACT's PearsonAccess ^{next} platform in Fall 2022.	

ACT Aspire Content Sections and Timing:

ACT Aspire is a timed test. ACT Aspire test sections may be administered in one day, or they may be spread out over multiple days. A test section must be completed on the day it was started and within the allotted time shown below.

ACHIEVEMENT ASSESSMENTS (cont.)

ACT Content Sections and Timing:

The ACT is a timed test. ACT test sections must be administered in one day. The content sections must be administered in the following order: **Test 1** – English (first), **Test 2** – Mathematics (second), **Test 3** – Reading (third), **Test 4** – Science (fourth), and **Test 5** – Writing (last). The ACT Writing test is always administered last. If this order is altered, tests will not be scored.

- AzSCI includes three test units. The approximate time for each test unit is about 60-90 minutes.
- Please note the overall AzSCI test is the same length as last year; however, based on challenges and feedback received, the AzSCI test has been split into three test units instead of two.
- When two or more test units are administered in a single day, a significant break must be given between test units. Test units must be completed on the day the unit is begun. **Do not start the test unit unless there is sufficient time to complete the testing session.**
- Once a test unit is begun, students may not take a break for lunch. During the test unit, students may only leave the room for a restroom break, visit to the nurse's office, or for emergency purposes.
