Understanding ACT ELA Scores

Did you know?

- To get an ACT® English Language Arts (ELA) score, students must take the ACT writing test – in addition to the English and reading tests.
- The ACT ELA score is calculated by taking the average of the English, reading, and writing scale scores.
 See the diagram for more details on how the score is derived.
- The ACT College Readiness
 Benchmark for ELA is 20. Students
 who meet the Benchmark are
 likely to do well in first-year
 English and social science courses.
- ACT ELA scores tend to be lower than ACT English and reading scores. Among students who had an ELA score and completed high school in 2020, the average scores were higher in English (19.7) and reading (21.2) than in ELA (19.1).
