- B. Contain research which align to ESSA guidelines/Federal Funding
- C. Increases likelihood of student outcomes when using evidence-based program

# II. The Current Need for Clearinghouses

- A. Allows LEAs to find the right fit for their unique student groups
- B. Assists leaders in finding trusted sources on programming
- C. Enables educators to streamline selection process of evidence-based programs

# III. Tips on Navigating Clearinghouses

- A. What Works Clearinghouse (WWC)
  - 1. Intervention Reports-summarize evidence from high quality research
  - 2. Reviews of Individual Studies are useful for subgroups/demographics
  - 3. Practice Guides contain best practices with detailed examples
  - 4. Click on info button for more details
  - 5. WWC only shows research at strong and/or moderate levels.

#### B. Evidence for ESSA

- 1. Search bar is character stringent, correct input of titles matters
- 2. Tier 1-3 (strong, moderate, promising)
- 3. Identifies programs and practices
- 4. "No studies met inclusion requirements" means check another clearinghouse

## C. Ohio Clearinghouse

- 1. Provides knowledge, tools, and resources
- 2. Begin a search via the home icon or menu bar on the top left
- 3. Filters include-subjects, grades, demographics, etc.
