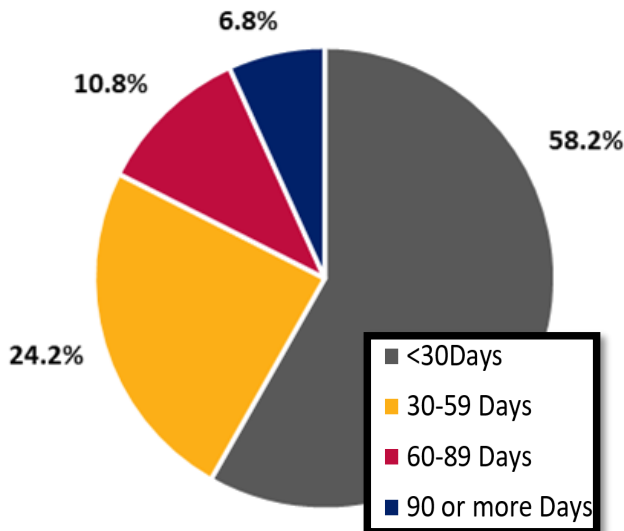

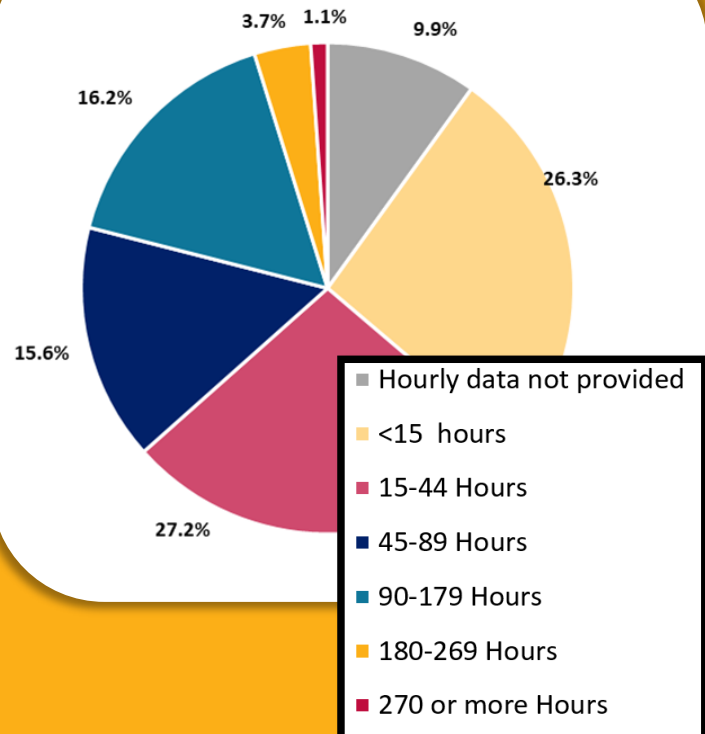

### Days of Programming Attended



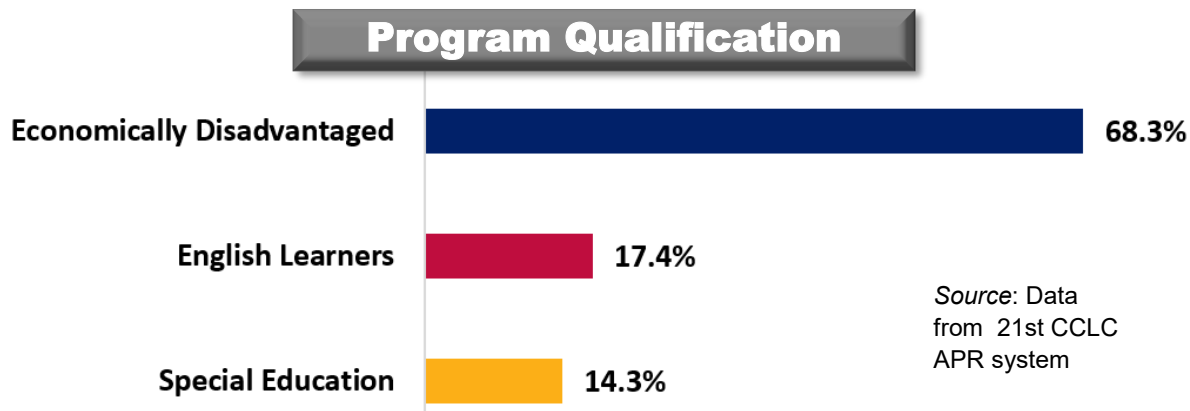
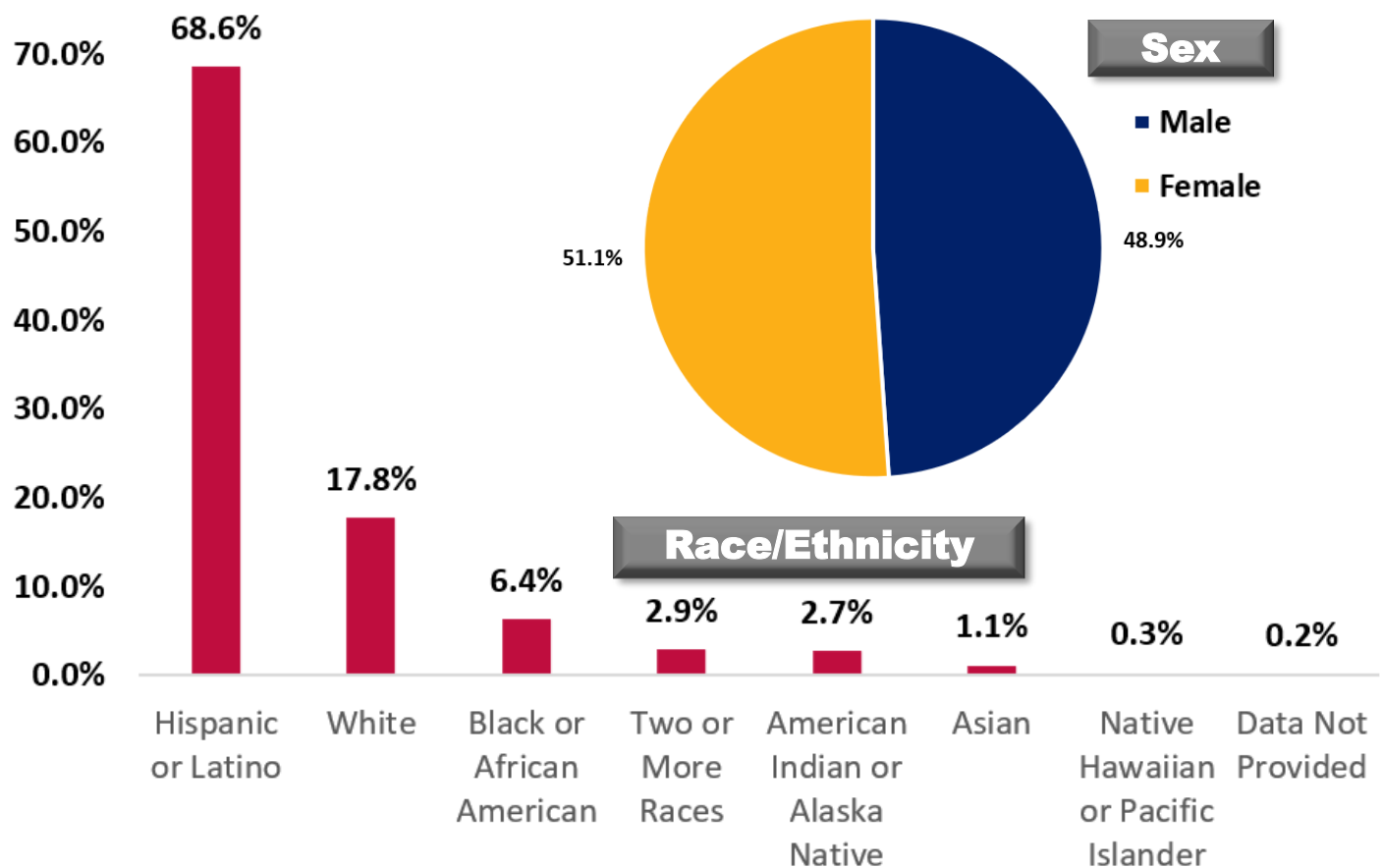
As Arizona refines this practice, we will start to dive deeper into hourly dosage and what this new dosage lens might tell us about 21st CCLC programming in Arizona.

### Hours of Programming Attended



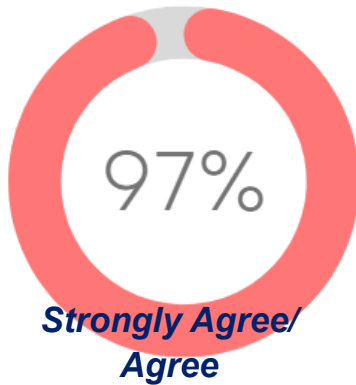

Since 2020, family engagement for sites across Arizona rapidly changed from random family involvement activities to being an integral part of education efforts.

During the 2021-2022 School year over fifty(50) 21st CCLC leaders from across Arizona participated in a 6 - month, nationwide, Action-Oriented Family Engagement cohort that focused on the framework of the “5 Simple Principles to Engage Every Family” led by the leading expert and well known author, Dr. Steven Constantino.

At the conclusion of this experience, several action research projects were presented as case studies to share to see results and learn from each other.

Starting with the 2022-2023 program year, **ALL** 21st CCLC sites will be required to submit state level programmatic reporting documents in **EMAC (Educational Monitoring, Assistance & Compliance)**.

For anyone new to using EMAC, the **Exploring EMAC** training provides the step-by-step direction on how to gain access to the EMAC system.

Cycle 17 sites piloted the EMAC System in 2021-2022.

### EMAC Monitoring Program for FY 22/23: 2022-2023 21st CCLC State Level Programmatic Reporting

All reports and communications will be maintained and easily accessible in EMAC from year to year. This will be a great benefit if a site experiences a Leadership change.

This will be the only required reporting **Monitoring Program** in EMAC for the 2022-2023 Fiscal Year.

It will contain separate 4 **Data Collection Tasks** for each of the state level programmatic reports, these are:

1. **Program At-A-Glance (September)**
2. **Summary of Classes I (January)**
3. **Summary of Classes II (June)**
4. **Site Evaluation (June)**

These **Data Collection Tasks** will become available in the EMAC system once training is provided on how to complete each report in EMAC.

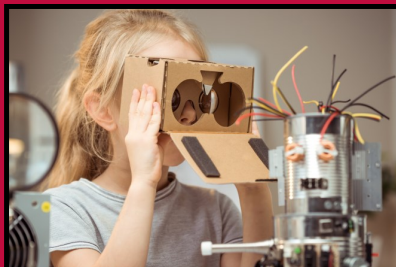
An LEA EMAC Administrator should grant access to staff who will be doing the following:

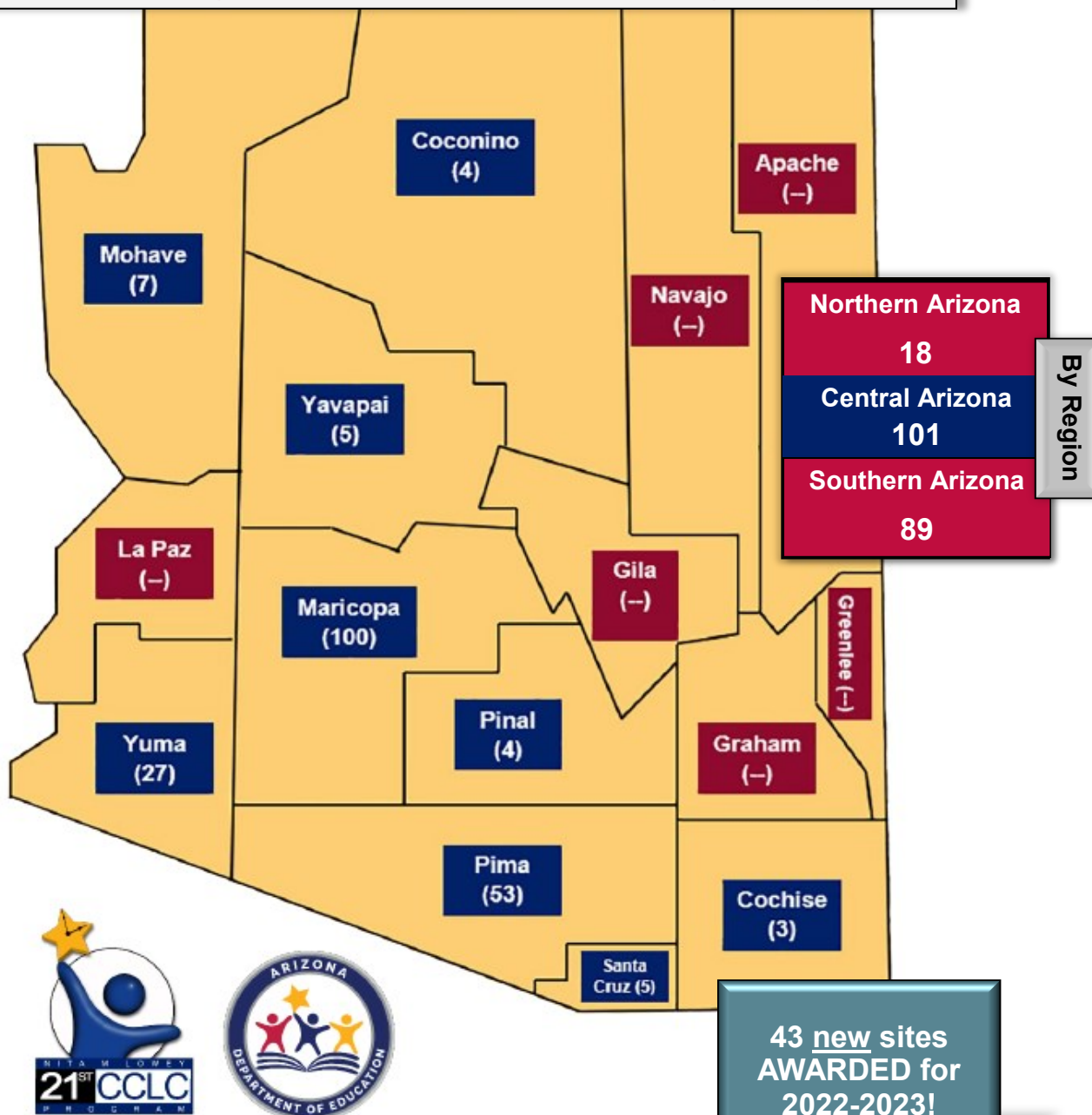

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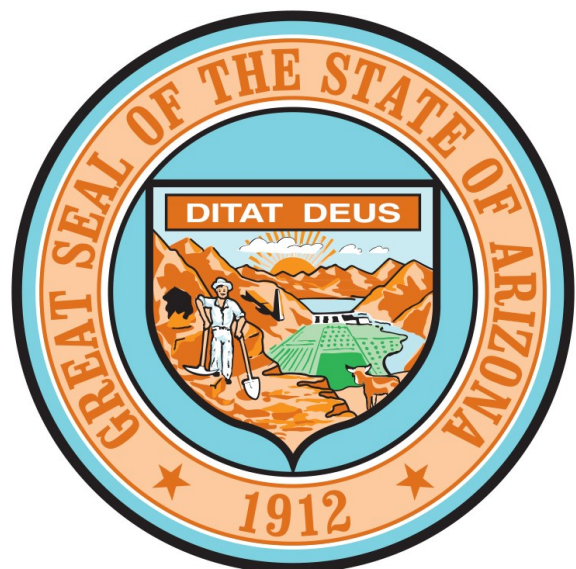
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
