

### Aggregate Expenditure Limit

- Article 9, Section 21 of the Arizona Constitution defines the expenditure limitation for school districts
- The Economic Estimates Commission calculates the <u>limit</u>
- School Finance calculates statewide expenditures subject to the limit
- If budgeted expenditures exceed the limit, legislature may approve or school districts are required to reduce budgets



## Aggregate Expenditure Limit





#### School Finance Calculation

- BUDG-AGD reports extract certain values from budget files submitted by school districts based on the definition of expenditures subject to the limit
- Expenditures in most school district funds are excluded
- Several specific items within otherwise included funds are also excluded
- Adjustments are made for items that are not possible to separate from district budgets
- Individual district numbers roll up to the statewide calculation



## FY 2023 Aggregate Expenditure Limit

\$1.15 billion over the limit in FY 2022

Limit increased by \$382 million to \$6.4 billion

- ARS <u>15-911</u> requires an annual report by 11/1 on aggregate expenditures of local revenue
- BUDG-AGD reports showing the FY 2023 calculation for each district will be available by 11/1



## FY 2023 Aggregate Expenditure Limit

- If over the limit and the legislature fails to authorize expenditures in excess of the limit by March 1st:
  - Each district is required to reduce expenditures based on the district's share of expenditures subject to the limit.
  - Budgets must be revised by April 1.
