GENERAL

The purpose of this annual survey is to provide the state educational agency and the U.S. Department of Education with current information on the location and number of children living in institutions for neglected or delinquent children. The information collected will be used for purposes of computing allocations for counties and local educational agencies as determined by Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). Failure to submit this report will result in the loss of funds to the local educational agency to provide services to meet the special educational needs of the children residing in this institution.

Institutions in which education is provided by a state agency should not be included. These institutions are reported separately.

In some cases, education for children in a state operated institution is provided by the local educational agency. The institution should be included in this survey of children in local institutions unless there are specific arrangements for reimbursement from the state agency responsible for providing free public education.

Directions for Local School Districts: Complete question #1 prior to sending to facility. A separate report should be distributed and completed by each of the Facilities/Institutions that meet the requirements of the definitions shown in Section I, Item #3. In the case of group homes under one administrative office, one report can be prepared for all the homes which are located in the same school district. SECTION I - INSTITUTION AND SCHOOL DISTRICT

- 1. Name and Address of Local Education Agency**
This is the school district in which the facility is physically located, regardless of where the children attend school.
- 2. Name and Address of Facility or Institution**
Enter the legal name and address of the facility or institution. If the name has changed since last year, please show the old name in parenthesis.
- 3. Type of Institution**
Check only one box to identify the type of institution being reported. If the institution serves both neglected and delinquent children, for classification purposes identify the majority of the children. If an institution does not meet the definitions of institutions cited in the Title-I Regulations, it should not be included for purposes of this survey.
Please note that the category of an institution should not change from year to year unless there has been an official change in the purpose for which the institution is operated. For example, if an institution is operated for the care of neglected children, but the majority of the children residing in the institution during October are children adjudicated to be delinquent, the children in that institutions should still be reported as neglected children until its charter or purpose is officially changed to show that it is an institution operated for the care of delinquent children. Consistency in reporting from year to year is necessary because changing the category of an institution each year based on the category of the majority of children served affects the hold-harmless allocations and eligibility under the Title-I, Part A formulas.
- 4. Legal or Administrative Basis for Designation of this Type of Institution**
State precisely the legal or administrative basis upon which this institution has been designated as an institution primarily for neglected children or adjudicated delinquent children. - 5. District Boundaries**
