What are alternate assessments?

Alternate assessments are designed for students with the most significant cognitive disabilities. Eligibility is determined by the IEP team annually following specific <u>eligibility</u> <u>criteria</u>.

The Alt ELPA is administered to English learners with the most significant cognitive disabilities in Grades K-12.

The Multi-State Alternate Assessment (MSAA) is administered to eligible students in Grades 3-8 and 11 in the areas of ELA, Mathematics and Science.



The Multi-State Alternate Assessment (MSAA) is a comprehensive assessment system designed to promote increasingly higher academic outcomes for students with the most significant cognitive disabilities in preparation for a broader array of post-secondary outcomes. The MSAA is designed to assess students with the most significant cognitive disabilities and measures academic content that is aligned to and derived from Arizona's academic content standards. This test contains many built-in supports that allow students to take the test using materials they are most familiar with and to communicate what they know and can do as independently as possible. The MSAA is administered in the areas of ELA and Mathematics in Grades 3-8 and 11 and Science in Grades 5, 8, and 11.

This assessment was developed through the research and development done by the National Center and State Collaborative (NCSC) and is being carried forward by the MSAA State Partners.

The MSAA is an online assessment, administered individually by a trained test administrator. The *Test Administration Manual* (TAM) contains detailed directions which include embedded accommodations tied to each item throughout the assessment. In addition to embedded accommodations, examples of the types of instructional accommodations which may be documented in the IEP for presentation, response, conditions, and timing are listed below. For important details on test preparation and administration, please consult the *MSAA Test Administration Manual* (TAM). If you have questions about using a routine instructional accommodation during testing, please contact <u>The Alternate Assessment Unit</u>.





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## What is **AZELLA**?

The Arizona English Language Learner Assessment (AZELLA) is:

- a standards-based assessment that meets both state and federal requirements to measure students' English language proficiency
- used for both placement and reassessment purposes

AZELLA assesses the four domains of the language: Listening, Reading, Writing, and Speaking.

### Who to test?

Upon **first enrollment** in an Arizona school, if any of the three questions on the Home Language Survey (HLS) form is answered with any language other than English or American Sign Language (ASL), the student must be administered an **AZELLA Placement Test**. The three questions are as follows:

- 1. What language do people speak in the home most of the time?
- 2. What language does the student speak *most* of the time?
- 3. What language did the student first speak or understand?

The <u>Spring Reassessment Test</u> is administered to all English learners until they obtain an Overall Level of Proficiency of <u>Proficient.</u>


