#### **State Tutoring Grant Funding and Participation:**

This is a competitive grant process for schools that received a letter grade of D or F on the A-F Accountability System.

#### **Student Eligibility:**

Any pupil attending a school that received a letter grade of D or F on the A-F Accountability System.

#### **Allocations:**

Allocations can be made after all revisions are complete, entered in GME, and approved by ADE. All applications must be received by **February 1, 2023, by 5 p.m.**

#### **Who is a tutor/coordinator?**

#### **State Tutoring – Important Dates and Deadlines FY23**

Since these grants are being allocated in December/January, your project start date needs to be stated in above narrative and will end by May 19, 2023.

It is expected that Completion Reports are done by August 21, 2023.

**The application deadline is January 13<sup>th</sup>**

If tutor names are available, please include them in contacts as well. 1. Please Provide a short description of your project in one to two paragraphs.
2. Will tutoring occur before school, after school or both?
3. Please state how many students have been identified that need state tutoring services:
  - a. How many for Math?
  - b. How many for ELA?
  - c. How many for both?

*These students should include the students targeting for tutoring services, not all kids eligible for tutoring services as these numbers can vary greatly.*

4. What are the means/measures for identifying these students? (Standards Based proficiency and/or other standards-based measures)

*Clearly state how you are identifying these students, both quantitative and qualitative measures are acceptable. Since we are into the school year, data from this fall would be the preferred data used to determine students for the tutoring program.*

5. What data or assessment(s) will be used to show how progress is measured.

*Clearly state data that will measure progress. Please note that the state assessment **does not** go down to the standard level and therefore **cannot** be used to measure progress. All tutoring services are based on grade-level standards and your measures must align to those standards as well.*

6. How many total tutoring hours are anticipated for the tutoring session/cycle?  
*Plan for 20 weeks max.*

**\*\* There is no state tutoring on grade level state assessment testing.***
