Who qualifies to apply for 21st CCLC funding?

School districts and charter organizations that have schools with 40% or higher economically disadvantaged rate.





Focus of 21st CCLC Funding

21st CCLC programs maintain a strong commitment to improving math, reading/ language arts /literacy, and science.

Programs supplement the students' regular academic school day by creating a rich learning environment before school, after school and during the summer.





Focus of 21st CCLC Funding

21st CCLC programs offer a wide variety of classes, project-based learning activities, and hands-on enrichment opportunities.

This enrichment includes offerings in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math), environmental literacy programs, arts, music and physical education, mentoring, technology education including coding, and nutrition and health education.







Target Populations

Students

At-risk students from pre-kindergarten to twelfth grade who attend schools with a high concentration of students from lowincome families

Adults & Families

Adult family members of students in the 21st CCLC program

Programs offer families of students ongoing, active and meaningful engagement in their children's education

March 6, 2023	Grant Application, including Forms A, B, C, D & E are DUE online in Grants Management System (GME) by 11:59 PM
June 2023 (TBD)	Official State Board of Education Approval-formal announcement of Grant Awards

What is the Minimum/Maximum Amount of Annual Award?

- Annual minimum is \$50,000 per site
 Annual maximum is \$120,000 per site
- Grants are awarded for five years






21st CCLC Programs In Arizona


Two Pathways for Eligible Entities to Apply for 21st CCLC Funding



Consortium Model

**There is no limit to subcontractors per site.

Consortium formed with a School District - Rarely, applicants choose this Consortium Model



HOW DOES THE 21st CCLC GRANT WORK IN ARIZONA?

- ADE supports geographic equity with rural priority points in the application process
- Tribes can be contracted service providers to educate youth in traditional ways
- Tribes can apply as a consortium with a Public School District
- Schools can apply for funds through BIE (not through the ADE 21st CCLC Program Area)









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
