- Knowledge in cybersecurity practices and access to available cyber resources is essential to all school districts.




Benefits of an AZ Chapter/Partnership





Year 2: While most students have returned to school locations, insufficient home connectivity remains a major challenge with disparities by ethnicity & socioeconomic status







COOPERATIVE PURCHASING PROGRAM SURVEY RESULTS



160+ Districts and Charter Systems in 14 AZ counties expressed interest

On average, responding LEAs plan to purchase, per year:

- 69,000 Chromebook devices
- 30,000 Windows laptops
- 4,800 Windows desktops
