APR Due Dates for 2022-2023

Due Dates for APR

- APR System Live for 2023: April 17th
 - Cannot access 2023 data until then
 - If no 2022 program, cannot access system until open for 2023 → will receive error message
- Reminder: Due Dates
 - Process Data- Due by June 16, 2023
 - Outcome Data- Due by September 15, 2023

APR Activities- what it is

- → 14 categories
- → Reporting Guide has definitions and possible classes
- → How many Participants in this Activity
 - → Deduplicated number per category, students can be counted in multiple categories
- → How many Total Hours
 - → Throughout the whole term





Spotlight: Activities (cont.)

APR Activities- what it is not

→ A perfect picture of your program

→ A comprehensive list of activities that perfectly fits all possible class ideas

→ An opportunity to report the nuance/color of each program

How to Calculate Activities Data

Total participants = unique student IDs for all classes under the activity category

Total hours = total of all hours on your calendar offered for all classes under the activity category

Summer		
Activity Type	How many participants attended this Activity during the term (Summer)?	How many total hours of this Activity did you offer during the term (Summer)?
Literacy Education	0	0
Science, Technology, Engineering, and	0	0
Mathematics, including Computer Science		

Ex: 4 classes x 1 hr each per day x 1 day per week x 16 weeks = 64 hours


Ex: 4 classes x 1 hr each per day x 4 days per week x 16 weeks = 256 hours

APR System will provide values in each of these cells where applicable

→ Based off Attendance Data in AzEDS- Activity Category Descriptor selected






ADE Will Provide Activities Calculations (cont.)

Each value can be updated if your calculation is different

→ If the count looks off, you can manually calculate to update


We anticipate under counting in some of our counts, especially with summer data and with Literacy Education and STEM

→ "Bad Data In = Bad Data Out"

Calculating Partnerships

How to Calculate the Value of a Partnership

- If monetary donation, value = amount of donation
- If in-kind, estimate value at market cost
 - Can round
- If volunteer, calculate salary/hourly wage
 - Reporting guide has examples





Calculating Partnerships (cont)

How to Calculate a Partially Paid Partnership

- Some partnerships are partially paid
 - A partnership with an organization that supplies 3 volunteer staff but you pay for a 4th
 - A partnership where you pay a set amount of money but the cost of the supplies and staffing hours they supply exceeds that amount of money
 - Ex: Your program pays \$500 for the year but the value they provide from free books to each family and 4 staff x 16 hours is \$1500
 - The APR value for this partnership is \$1000







Spotlight on: Data Collection

OPTIONAL APR Data Collection Templates

- To help collect data prior to entering in system
 - Useful if collecting from multiple sources or if district will be doing data entry
- Can be edited/adapted as necessary
 - NOT where data is submitted (that's the 21st CCLC APR Data Reporting System, opening April 2023)


