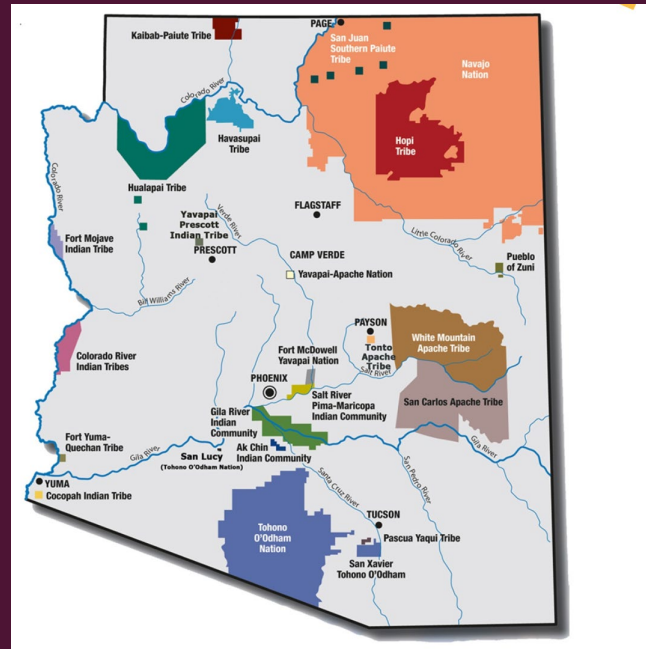

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# WHAT IS THE CLIC PROJECT?

- 2-year, ADE grant-funded project
- We aim to facilitate ten leadership teams (7 members each) of Native American and Indigenous community members throughout Arizona to work toward ameliorating an educational issue or goal (goals/issues determined by leadership teams).
  - Leadership being considered broadly: teams can include combinations of official school and community leaders, as well as extended kin and school network educators serving their communities, youth, and more.
- CLIC will provide...
  - Five culturally responsive and relevant leadership training modules (called Learning Collaboratives)
    - Approved and co-created amongst CLIC advisory council, community leadership teams, and CLIC team
    - On-site/online at no cost to participants

# EXAMPLES OF TRAINING MODULES

- Principled Innovation
- Difficult/Crucial/Courageous Conversations
- Shared/Distributive Leadership
- Facilitating Solutions to Big Problems (busing, food insecurity, Opioid Crisis, Trauma-Informed Care, Health & Wellness...others can be determined by leadership teams)

# ADDITIONAL CLIC COMPONENTS/OFFERINGS

- Multi-level leadership coaching and mentoring services (2 coaches per leadership team)
  - Why coaching?
    - Support transitions from informal to formal leadership roles
    - Increase diversity in gender, generation, and expertise by more purposeful selection of leadership team members
    - Assist in developing respectful and culturally intelligent processes by which leadership teams and individuals can engage multiple and diverse perspectives when making decisions.
    - Create pools of thoughtful and reflective leaders who focus on designing creative, culturally intelligent solutions
    - Develop a process through which teams will use multiple tools to help to gather feedback and input from underrepresented groups in decision-making at schools, including parents, care givers, community members, staff, and students

# ADDITIONAL CLIC COMPONENTS/OFFERINGS

- CLIC also offers **nine credits of university coursework (fully funded)** to leadership team members who choose to participate in the MLFTC Leadership Institute
  - In addition to Learning Collaborative training modules
  - Credits can be transferred into the MEd in Educational Leadership or into other programs and professional learning opportunities available at MLFTC/ASU.
  - Can also be used toward undergraduate degree programs.
  - Credits can be 'stored' for up to 3 years
- Two-day conference in Tempe, AZ for leadership team members to meet, collaborate, and share ideas.
  - Travel, meals, and lodging costs covered for all participants.

- Multi-Level Coaching: September 2023 – July 2024
- MLFTC Leadership Institute: May 2024 – July 2024
